HOUSE BILL NO. 296

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 1-1-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 PROVIDE SETS OF THE MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972 TO THE PARALEGAL 3 PROGRAMS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN MISSISSIPPI AND MISSISSIPPI 4 UNIVERSITY FOR WOMEN; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 1-1-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 1-1-11. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this 9 section, the Joint Committee on Compilation, Revision and 10 Publication of Legislation shall distribute or provide for the 11 distribution of the sets of the compilation of the Mississippi 12 Code of 1972 purchased by the state as follows:

Fifty-seven (57) sets to the Mississippi House of Representatives and forty (40) sets to the Mississippi Senate for the use of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Legislative Services Offices, staffs and committees thereof.

17 Ten (10) sets to the Governor's Office; nine (9) sets to the Secretary of State; and twenty (20) sets to the Auditor's Office. 18 One (1) set to each of the following: the Lieutenant 19 20 Governor; each member of the Legislature; the Treasurer; each district attorney; each county attorney; each judge of the Court 21 22 of Appeals and each judge of the Supreme, circuit, chancery, county, family, justice and municipal courts; each Mississippi 23 24 Senator and Mississippi Representative in Congress; State 25 Superintendent of Education; Director of the Department of Finance and Administration; six (6) sets to the Performance Evaluation and 26 27 Expenditure Review (PEER) Committee, two (2) sets to the Director

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of the Legislative Budget Office; the Commissioner of Agriculture 28 29 and Commerce; each Mississippi Transportation Commissioner; six 30 (6) sets to the Department of Corrections; the Insurance Commissioner; the Clerk of the Supreme Court; the State Board of 31 32 Health; each circuit clerk; each chancery clerk in the state for 33 the use of the chancery clerk and the board of supervisors; each sheriff in the state for the use of his office and the county 34 officers; and each county for the county library (and an 35 additional set shall be given to each circuit clerk, chancery 36 37 clerk, sheriff and county library in counties having two (2) 38 judicial districts).

Two (2) sets to the Department of Archives and History; two 39 40 (2) sets to the State Soil and Water Conservation Commission; 41 sixty-eight (68) sets to the Attorney General's Office; six (6) sets to the Public Service Commission; four (4) sets to the Public 42 Utilities Staff; thirty-six (36) sets to the State Tax Commission; 43 44 two (2) sets to the State Personnel Board; six (6) sets to the State Law Library; one (1) set to the Library of Congress; ten 45 (10) sets to the University of Mississippi Law School; one (1) set 46 47 each to the paralegal programs at the University of Southern Mississippi and Mississippi University for Women; one (1) set each 48 49 to the Mississippi School for the Deaf and the Mississippi School for the Blind; one (1) set each to the University of Mississippi, 50 Mississippi State University, Mississippi University for Women, 51 52 University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State University, Alcorn 53 State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi Valley 54 State University, and the Board of Trustees of State Institutions 55 of Higher Learning; and one (1) set to the Supreme Court judges' conference room. In furtherance of the State Library's reciprocal 56 program of code exchange with libraries of the several states, the 57 58 joint committee shall, at the direction and only upon the written 59 request of the State Librarian, distribute or provide for the distribution of sets of the code to such libraries. 60

No. 296 *HRO3/R672* 01/HR03/R672 PAGE 2 (RF\LH) 61 One (1) set to each state junior or community college; three 62 (3) sets to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks; two 63 (2) sets to the Department of Environmental Quality; two (2) sets 64 to the Department of Marine Resources; two (2) sets to the 65 Mississippi Ethics Commission; six (6) sets to the Mississippi 66 Workers' Compensation Commission; four (4) sets to the State 67 Department of Rehabilitation Services; and seven (7) sets to the Department of Human Services. One (1) set to each of the 68 following: State Textbook Procurement Commission; University 69 70 Medical Center; State Library Commission; Department of 71 Agriculture and Commerce; Forestry Commission; and seventeen (17) sets to the Department of Public Safety. Also, one (1) set to 72 73 each of the following: Adjutant General, Department of Economic 74 and Community Development, Department of Banking and Consumer 75 Finance, Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, 76 the State Educational Finance Commission, the Mississippi Board of Vocational and Technical Education, Division of Medicaid, State 77 78 Board of Mental Health, and Department of Youth Services.

The joint committee is authorized to distribute or provide for the distribution of additional sets of the Mississippi Code, not to exceed three (3) sets, to the office of each district attorney for the use of his assistants.

The joint committee shall provide to the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate the annual supplements to the Mississippi Code of 1972 for each set of the code maintained by the House and Senate.

The set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to be provided to each member of the Legislature shall be provided unless specifically waived by such legislator in writing.

90 An elected or appointed officeholder in the State of 91 Mississippi, except for a member of the Legislature, shall deliver 92 to his successor in office, or to the joint committee if there is

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95 Before the joint committee delivers or provides for delivery 96 of a copy of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to an individual 97 officeholder, the joint committee shall prepare and submit a 98 written agreement to the officeholder. The agreement shall, among 99 other provisions, state that the code is the property of the State of Mississippi, that it shall be transferred to the officeholder's 100 successor in office, that the officeholder has an obligation to 101 102 make such transfer and that the officeholder shall be responsible 103 for the failure to deliver the code and for any damage or destruction to the code, normal wear and tear excepted. The joint 104 105 committee shall execute the agreement and forward it to the officeholder for execution. The joint committee shall not deliver 106 or provide for delivery of the code to the officeholder until the 107 executed agreement is received by the committee. The joint 108 109 committee may include in the agreement such other provisions as it 110 may deem reasonable and necessary. In addition to damages or any other remedy for not transferring a set of the code to his 111 112 successor, an officeholder who does not transfer his set of the 113 code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, 114 pay a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon request of the joint committee, the Attorney General shall assist the joint 115 116 committee in taking such actions as necessary to require an 117 officeholder to transfer the set of code provided under this 118 section to his successor, or to the joint committee if there is no 119 successor, and to recover reimbursement or damages from any 120 officeholder for the loss of or damage or destruction to any volumes of the set of the code provided under this section, other 121 122 than normal wear and tear.

123 Replacement of missing, damaged or destroyed sets or volumes 124 of the code provided by this chapter may be obtained from the code

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127 No more than one (1) set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 128 shall be furnished to any one (1) individual, regardless of the 129 office or offices he may hold.

130 (2) The joint committee, in its discretion, may determine 131 whether electronic access to the Mississippi Code of 1972 is 132 available and a sufficient substitute for actual bound volumes of 133 the code and, if so, may omit furnishing any one or more sets 134 otherwise required by this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001.
