HOUSE BILL NO. 320

AN ACT TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONDUCT A 1 STUDY ON THE PRESCRIBED USE OF PSYCHIATRIC DRUGS BY SCHOOL-AGE 2 CHILDREN IN THIS STATE AND THE EFFECTS OF PSYCHIATRIC DRUGS ON THOSE CHILDREN, AND TO PRESENT A REPORT OF ITS STUDY TO THE 3 4 LEGISLATURE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. (1) The Legislature finds that: (a) During the past decade the number of American 8 children receiving psychiatric drugs for behavioral and emotional 9 disorders has increased dramatically; and 10 (b) National medical reports indicate that psychiatric 11 drugs are prescribed to between five and six million children each 12 year, who represent about ten percent (10%) of the total 13 14 school-age population; and The International Narcotics Control Board of the 15 (C) World Health Organization has reported that the United States is 16 among the leading users of psychiatric drugs and has warned us 17 against our national trend to overprescribe stimulants for 18 19 children; and Opponents of the use of psychiatric drugs express 20 (d) concern that there is not enough information about the drugs' 21 22 effect on children's development or on their long-term side 23 effects, while proponents say that children sometimes need medication to combat mental illnesses. 24 The State Department of Health shall conduct a study on 25 (2)the prescribed use of psychiatric drugs by school-age children in 26 27 this state and the effects of psychiatric drugs on those children, and shall provide recommendations for improved oversight of the 28

The 30 department shall present a report of its study, together with any 31 recommended legislation, to the Legislature not later than 32 December 15, 2001. 33 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

34 and after July 1, 2001.
