HOUSE BILL NO. 353

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 65-3-97, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1
- ADD A CERTAIN SEGMENT OF MISSISSIPPI HIGHWAY 3 IN QUITMAN COUNTY 2 3
 - TO PHASE 1V OF THE FOUR-LANE HIGHWAY PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED
- 4 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 65-3-97, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- amended as follows: 7
- 65-3-97. (1) In addition to and including all other 8
- 9 highways designated as a part of the state highway system, there
- is hereby designated as a part thereof a four-lane highway system 10
- to connect various areas of the state with interstate and primary 11
- highways. The Mississippi Department of Transportation shall 12
- construct and reconstruct four-lane highways, that is, not less 13
- than two (2) lanes for traffic flowing in each direction, along 14
- the routes designated in this section. 15
- In the construction and reconstruction of the four-lane 16
- 17 highway system designated in this section, the Mississippi
- Department of Transportation may utilize the roadway of any 18
- existing highway under its jurisdiction and control and shall do 19
- so when such utilization is feasible, provided that such highways 20
- which are utilized shall be constructed to current standards for 21
- such roadways. When it is not feasible to utilize existing 22
- designated highways, the Transportation Department shall relocate 23
- such highways and construct entirely new facilities whether in 24
- urban or rural areas. 25
- 26 (3) Construction of the four-lane highway system designated
- in this subsection shall commence, proceed and be performed by the 27
- Mississippi Department of Transportation strictly in accordance 28

- 29 with the following set of priorities established for the letting
- 30 of contracts on and along various segments thereof:
- 31 (a) Of the following group of highway segments not less
- 32 than fifteen percent (15%) of all contracts necessary to be let
- 33 for completion of all segments within the group shall be let by
- 34 June 30, 1988, not less than thirty percent (30%) of such
- 35 contracts shall be let by June 30, 1989, not less than fifty
- 36 percent (50%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1990, not
- 37 less than seventy percent (70%) of such contracts shall be let by
- 38 June 30, 1991, not less than ninety percent (90%) of such
- 39 contracts shall be let by June 30, 1992, and one hundred percent
- 40 (100%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1993:
- 41 (i) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45
- 42 beginning at the Clarke/Lauderdale county line and extending
- 43 northerly to I-59; then beginning at Macon and extending northerly
- 44 to Brooksville; then beginning at Columbus Air Force Base and
- 45 extending northerly to Aberdeen; then beginning at U.S. 278 and
- 46 extending northerly to Shannon; then beginning at Saltillo and
- 47 extending northerly to Corinth.
- 48 (ii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45A
- 49 beginning at U.S. 82 and extending northerly to West Point; then
- 50 beginning four (4) miles south of Okolona and extending northerly
- 51 to Shannon.
- 52 (iii) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 53 beginning at U.S. 49 and extending westerly through Yazoo City to
- 54 the Yazoo River.
- (iv) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 56 beginning at Inverness and extending northerly to Indianola.
- 57 (v) A highway segment along or near U.S. 61
- 58 beginning at Port Gibson and extending northerly to the four-lane
- 59 south of Vicksburg.
- (vi) Highway segments along or near U.S. 72
- 61 beginning at or near Mt. Pleasant and extending southeasterly to

- 62 Mississippi 5; then beginning at Walnut and extending
- 63 southeasterly to Corinth; then beginning at Strickland and
- 64 extending southeasterly to Burnsville.
- (vii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 78
- 66 beginning at Holly Springs and extending southeasterly to the New
- 67 Albany bypass; then beginning at Mississippi 25 and extending

- 70 beginning at I-55 and extending easterly to Kilmichael; then
- 71 beginning at Eupora and extending easterly to Mathiston; then

- 74 (ix) A highway segment along or near U.S. 84
- 75 beginning at I-59 and extending easterly to the Jones/Wayne county
- 76 line.
- 77 (x) Highway segments along or near U.S. 98
- 78 beginning at Columbia and extending easterly to the Marion/Lamar
- 79 county line; then beginning at U.S. 49 and extending southeasterly
- 80 to the Alabama state line.
- 81 (b) Of the following group of highway segments not less
- 82 than five percent (5%) of all contracts necessary to be let for
- 83 completion of all segments within the group shall be let by June
- 84 30, 1991, not less than ten percent (10%) of such contracts shall
- 85 be let by June 30, 1992, not less than twenty-five percent (25%)
- 86 of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1993, not less than
- 87 forty percent (40%) of such contracts shall be let by June 30,
- 88 1994, not less than fifty-five percent (55%) of such contracts
- 89 shall be let by June 30, 1995, not less than seventy percent (70%)
- 90 of such contracts shall be let by June 30, 1996, not less than
- 91 eighty-five percent (85%) of such contracts shall be let by June
- 92 30, 1997, and one hundred percent (100%) of such contracts shall
- 93 be let by June 30, 1998:

- 97 line and extending northeasterly to Starkville.
- 98 (ii) A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 99 63 beginning at the Jackson/George county line and extending
- 100 northerly to Lucedale.
- 101 (iii) A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 102 302 beginning at I-55 in Southaven and extending easterly to U.S.
- 103 72 at or near Mt. Pleasant.
- 104 (iv) Highway segments along or near U.S. 45
- 105 beginning at the Alabama state line and extending northerly to the
- 106 Clarke/Lauderdale county line; then beginning at Lauderdale and
- 107 extending northerly to Macon; then beginning at Aberdeen and
- 108 extending northerly to U.S. 278.
- 109 (v) A highway segment along or near U.S. 45A
- 110 beginning at West Point and extending northerly to four (4) miles
- 111 south of Okolona.
- 112 (vi) A highway segment beginning at Brooksville
- along or near U.S. 45 or U.S. 45A and extending northerly to U.S.
- 114 82, such segment having been designated by the Transportation
- 115 Commission pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (1)(c) of this
- 116 section.
- 117 (vii) A highway segment along or near U.S. 49W
- 118 beginning at the Yazoo River and extending northerly to Inverness.
- 119 (viii) Highway segments along or near U.S. 61
- 120 beginning at the Louisiana state line and extending northerly to
- 121 the Wilkinson/Adams county line; then beginning at Washington and
- 122 extending northerly to Port Gibson; then beginning at Merigold and
- 123 extending northerly to Shelby; then beginning at the north end of
- 124 the Clarksdale bypass and extending northerly to the Tennessee

- 201 26 and extending northerly to U.S. Highway 98.
- F. A highway segment along or near
- 203 Mississippi 19 beginning at Collinsville and extending
- 204 northwesterly to Kosciusko.
- G. Highway segments along or near Mississippi
- 206 25 beginning at Aberdeen and extending northerly to Fulton; then
- 207 beginning at the Alabama state line and extending northerly to
- 208 U.S. Highway 72.
- H. A highway segment along or near U.S.
- 210 Highway 61 beginning at Redwood and extending northerly to Leland.
- 211 <u>I.</u> A highway segment along or near U.S.
- 212 Highway 98 beginning at Meadville and extending southeasterly to
- 213 Summit.
- 214 <u>J.</u> A highway segment along or near
- 215 Mississippi Highway 24/48 beginning at Woodville and extending
- 216 easterly to McComb.
- 217 K. A highway segment along or near Mississippi
- 218 35 beginning at the Mississippi/Louisiana state line and extending
- 219 northerly to or near Foxworth.
- $\underline{\text{L.}}$ A highway segment along or near
- 221 Mississippi 27 beginning at I-20 and extending southeasterly to
- 222 I-55.

M. A highway segment along or near 223 Mississippi 57 beginning at I-10 and extending northerly ten (10) 224 miles to just north of the community of Van Cleave. 225 226 (ii) Contracts for the construction and/or 227 reconstruction of highway segments designated within this group shall be let by the Transportation Commission strictly in 228 accordance with the volume capacity of the highway segment. 229 the volume capacity of a highway segment is less than the volume 230 231 capacity threshold at which the Transportation Department recommends the construction of a four-lane highway, then the 232 233 Transportation Department shall make other improvements and highway modifications to such highway segment as needed, such as 234 235 straightening and realignment of the existing roadway, the addition of passing lanes and the widening of existing lanes, and 236 may acquire any necessary right-of-way for such purposes and for 237 238 the purpose of future construction of four-lane highways along 239 such segments. 240 The construction priorities established in this section 241

- shall not be construction priorities established in this section shall not be construed as prohibiting the completion of highway segments which, on July 1, 1987, are included in the current three-year plan under Section 65-1-141, and for which, on July 1, 1987, grade and drainage has been completed or contracts for grade and drainage have been let.
- Contracts may be let and construction may commence and 246 247 be performed concurrently on any of the highway segments designated in subsection (3) of this section, notwithstanding the 248 priorities established for the letting of contracts on the various 249 250 segments designated therein, provided that funds are available 251 and, provided that, at all times, the percentages of all contracts 252 required to be let on the segments designated in paragraphs (3)(a), (3)(b), (3)(c) and (3)(d), respectively, are, in fact, let 253 254 no later than the dates established therein.

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- (6) (a) All highway construction and reconstruction

 authorized under this section shall be performed by contract let

 on competitive bid in the manner provided by statute; however,

 highway segments shall be constructed in lengths of not less than

 ten (10) miles.
- It is the intent of the Legislature that not less 260 261 than ten percent (10%) of the amounts authorized to be expended for construction and reconstruction of the four-lane highway 262 segments designated in this section shall be expended with small 263 business concerns owned and controlled by socially and 264 265 economically disadvantaged individuals. The term "socially and 266 economically disadvantaged individuals" shall have the meaning ascribed to such term under Section 8(d) of the Small Business Act 267 (15 USCS, Section 637(d)) and relevant subcontracting regulations 268 269 promulgated pursuant thereto; except that women shall be presumed to be socially and economically disadvantaged individuals for the 270 purposes of this paragraph (b). 271
- (7) (a) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (6)(a)
 of this section, the Mississippi Transportation Commission may
 construct highway segments of less than ten (10) miles in length
 if:
- (i) The segment as described in subsection (3) of this section is less than ten (10) miles in length;
- 278 (ii) The segment will connect two (2) existing 279 four-lane highways;
- 280 (iii) The segment will connect an existing 281 four-lane highway with an incorporated municipality;
- (iv) The segment will connect an existing
 four-lane highway with a river, the state boundary or any other
 natural or man-made barrier;
- (v) For a particular project, the costs of constructing a single segment of at least ten (10) miles in length

287 would greatly exceed the aggregate costs of constructing two (2)

288 or more segments; or

289 (vi) The segment is in an urban area and involves

290 the completion of bypasses or other construction which will

291 facilitate and accommodate major traffic movement.

292 (b) In any case in which the Transportation Commission

293 authorizes the construction of a highway segment of less than ten

294 (10) miles in length, the commission shall set forth and record in

its official minutes explanation and justification therefor based

upon one or more of the conditions prescribed in paragraph (7)(a)

297 of this section.

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298 (8) To assist in defraying the costs and expenses for

299 construction, reconstruction and relocation of the four-lane

highway system described in this section, the following revenues

301 shall be paid out of such funds made available to the

302 Transportation Commission and the Transportation Department:

303 (a) From matched federal funds or other federal funds,

Thirty-two Million Dollars (\$32,000,000.00) for fiscal year 1988,

Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$25,000,000.00) for fiscal year 1989,

306 Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) for fiscal year 1990 and

fifty percent (50%) of such federal funds for fiscal year 1991 and

308 each fiscal year thereafter; and

309 (b) Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) from matched

310 federal bridge replacement funds for fiscal year 1988 and each

311 fiscal year thereafter when the segments proposed for construction

312 contain bridges that are eligible for replacement under the

313 Federal Aid Bridge Replacement Program.

314 (9) The Transportation Department shall submit a report to

315 the Legislature by January 10 of each calendar year setting forth

316 the current status of the construction program set forth in this

317 section to include, but not be limited to, the following

318 information:

- (h) For each fiscal year beginning in 1994, a detailed
- 335 cash flow projection by source of program activities and an
- 336 estimate of when the program will encounter a funding shortage due
- 337 to costs exceeding original projections;
- 338 (i) A schedule of all complete and open-to-traffic
- 339 highway segments and the related total cost of each segment;
- 340 (j) A schedule of all highway segments on which all
- 341 contracts necessary for completion of the segments were not let as
- 342 of the date required by law;
- 343 (k) A complete recap of all program receipts by source,
- 344 and of all disbursements for the prior fiscal year and cumulative
- 345 totals since the inception of the program as compared to
- 346 projections; and
- 347 (1) A statement from the Department of Transportation
- 348 regarding the status of the funding of the program based on agency
- 349 cost experience and projections for the future.



350	The report shall be deemed submitted when ten (10) copies are
351	submitted to the Clerk of the House of Representatives and ten
352	(10) copies are submitted to the Secretary of the Senate.
353	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
354	and after July 1, 2001.
