COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 396

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO AWARD
HONORARY HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS TO WORLD WAR II AND KOREAN CONFLICT
VETERANS WHO WERE UNABLE TO COMPLETE THEIR EDUCATION DUE TO THEIR
MILITARY SERVICE; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO
DEVELOP A UNIFORM APPLICATION FOR THE DIPLOMA; TO ENCOURAGE THE
STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATE RECOGNITION IN
AWARDING DIPLOMAS TO VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 $\underline{\text{SECTION 1.}}$ (1) The State Board of Education may award an
- 10 honorary high school diploma in a form prescribed by the board to
- 11 veterans of World War II and the Korean Conflict who were unable
- 12 to complete their education due to their military service. The
- 13 honorary diploma is available to any honorably discharged veteran
- 14 residing in Mississippi who was scheduled to graduate between 1941
- 15 and 1955 but was inducted into military service before completing
- 16 the necessary graduation requirements. Family members of deceased
- 17 eligible veterans may apply for the diploma to be awarded
- 18 posthumously.
- 19 (2) The State Board of Education shall develop a uniform
- 20 application for persons seeking a diploma under subsection (1) of
- 21 this section. The application shall request no less than the
- 22 following information:
- 23 (a) The veteran's name, social security number and date
- 24 of birth;
- 25 (b) The last year the veteran was in school and the
- 26 veteran's grade level during that year;
- 27 (c) The year the veteran left school to enter World War
- 28 II or the Korean Conflict;

- 31 (e) The name and location of the school attended;
- 32 (f) The date of the veteran's enlistment or draft;
- 33 (g) The veteran's service number;
- 34 (h) The veteran's date of honorable discharge;
- 35 (i) A copy of the veteran's DD-214 form, if available;
- 36 and
- 37 (j) Any other information deemed relevant by the State
- 38 Board of Education.
- 39 The State Board of Education shall provide the State Veterans
- 40 Affairs Board, local school districts and county departments of
- 41 human services with copies of the uniform application.
- 42 (3) A person may request an application from a local school
- 43 district, any county department of human services, the State
- 44 Department of Education or the State Veterans Affairs Board.
- 45 Completed applications for a diploma may be submitted to the State
- 46 Board of Education. Upon verifying the information contained in
- 47 the application, including verifying the veteran's military
- 48 service information with the State Veterans Affairs Board, and
- 49 determining the veteran's eligibility for the honorary high school
- 50 diploma, the State Board of Education may award the diploma to the
- 51 veteran.
- 52 (4) The State Board of Education is encouraged to provide
- 53 appropriate recognition, which may include special ceremonies, to
- 54 veterans who are awarded honorary high school diplomas under this
- 55 section.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 57 and after July 1, 2001.
