## HOUSE BILL NO. 396

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO AWARD 1 HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS AND HONORARY EIGHTH GRADE CERTIFICATES OF 2 COMPLETION TO WORLD WAR II AND KOREAN CONFLICT VETERANS WHO WERE 3 UNABLE TO COMPLETE THEIR EDUCATION DUE TO THEIR MILITARY SERVICE; 4 TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP A UNIFORM 5 APPLICATION FOR THE DIPLOMA AND CERTIFICATE; TO ENCOURAGE THE 6 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATE RECOGNITION IN 7 AWARDING DIPLOMAS AND CERTIFICATES TO VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED 8 PURPOSES. 9

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) The State Board of Education may award a 11
- 12 standard high school diploma in the form prescribed by the board
- to veterans of World War II and the Korean Conflict who were 13
- 14 unable to complete their high school curriculum due to their
- 15 military service. The diploma is available to any honorably
- 16 discharged veteran residing in Mississippi who, as a ninth, tenth,
- eleventh or twelfth grade student, was scheduled to graduate 17
- between 1941 and 1955 but was inducted into military service 18
- before completing the necessary graduation requirements. Family 19
- 20 members of deceased eligible veterans may apply for the diploma to
- 21 be awarded posthumously.
- (2) (a) The State Board of Education may award an honorary 22
- 23 eighth grade certificate of completion to veterans of World War II
- and the Korean Conflict who were unable to complete their primary 24
- school curriculum due to their military service. The certificate 25
- is available to any honorably discharged veteran residing in 26
- 27 Mississippi who, as a student in a grade lower than the ninth
- 28 grade, was inducted into military service before completing the

- 29 veteran's primary education. Family members of deceased eligible
- 30 veterans may apply for the certificate to be awarded posthumously.
- 31 (b) The State Board of Education shall design an
- 32 honorary eighth grade certificate of completion specifically for
- 33 veterans who are eligible for the certificate under this section.
- 34 (3) The State Board of Education shall develop a uniform
- 35 application for persons seeking a diploma under subsection (1) or
- 36 an honorary eighth grade certificate of completion under
- 37 subsection (2) of this section. The application shall request no
- 38 less than the following information:
- 39 (a) The veteran's name, social security number and date
- 40 of birth;
- 41 (b) The last year the veteran was in school and the
- 42 veteran's grade level during that year;
- 43 (c) The year the veteran left school to enter World War
- 44 II or the Korean Conflict;
- 45 (d) The year the veteran would have graduated from high
- 46 school;
- (e) The name and location of the school attended;
- 48 (f) The date of the veteran's enlistment or draft;
- 49 (g) The veteran's service number;
- 50 (h) The veteran's date of honorable discharge;
- 51 (i) A copy of the veteran's DD-214 form, if available;
- 52 and
- (j) Any other information deemed relevant by the State
- 54 Board of Education.
- 55 The State Board of Education shall provide the State Veterans
- 56 Affairs Board, local school districts and county departments of
- 57 human services with copies of the uniform application.
- 58 (3) A person may request an application from a local school
- 59 district, any county department of human services, the State
- 60 Department of Education or the State Veterans Affairs Board.
- 61 Completed applications for a diploma or certificate may be

- 62 submitted to the State Board of Education. Upon verifying the
- 63 information contained in the application, including verifying the
- 64 veteran's military service information with the State Veterans
- 65 Affairs Board, and determining the veteran's eligibility for
- 66 either the standard high school diploma or honorary eighth grade
- 67 certificate of completion, the State Board of Education may award
- 68 the diploma or certificate to the veteran.
- 69 (4) The State Board of Education is encouraged to provide
- 70 appropriate recognition, which may include special ceremonies, to
- 71 veterans who are awarded high school diplomas or eighth grade
- 72 certificates of completion under this section.
- 73 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 74 and after July 1, 2001.
