COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 396

1 AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO AWARD 2 HONORARY HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS TO WORLD WAR II AND KOREAN CONFLICT 3 VETERANS WHO WERE UNABLE TO COMPLETE THEIR EDUCATION DUE TO THEIR 4 MILITARY SERVICE; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO 5 DEVELOP A UNIFORM APPLICATION FOR THE DIPLOMA; TO ENCOURAGE THE 6 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO PROVIDE APPROPRIATE RECOGNITION IN 7 AWARDING DIPLOMAS TO VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. (1) The State Board of Education may award an honorary high school diploma in a form prescribed by the board to 10 veterans of World War II and the Korean Conflict who were unable 11 12 to complete their education due to their military service. The 13 honorary diploma is available to any honorably discharged veteran 14 residing in Mississippi who was scheduled to graduate between 1941 and 1955 but was inducted into military service before completing 15 the necessary graduation requirements. Family members of deceased 16 eligible veterans may apply for the diploma to be awarded 17 18 posthumously.

19 (2) The State Board of Education shall develop a uniform 20 application for persons seeking a diploma under subsection (1) of 21 this section. The application shall request no less than the 22 following information:

23 (a) The veteran's name, social security number and date24 of birth;

(b) The last year the veteran was in school and theveteran's grade level during that year;

(c) The year the veteran left school to enter World War
II or the Korean Conflict;

29 (d) The year the veteran would have graduated from high 30 school; 31 (e) The name and location of the school attended; 32 (f) The date of the veteran's enlistment or draft; 33 (g) The veteran's service number;

34 (h) The veteran's date of honorable discharge;

35 (i) A copy of the veteran's DD-214 form, if available;
36 and

37 (j) Any other information deemed relevant by the State38 Board of Education.

39 The State Board of Education shall provide the State Veterans 40 Affairs Board, local school districts and county departments of 41 human services with copies of the uniform application.

42 (3) A person may request an application from a local school district, any county department of human services, the State 43 Department of Education or the State Veterans Affairs Board. 44 45 Completed applications for a diploma may be submitted to the State 46 Board of Education. Upon verifying the information contained in the application, including verifying the veteran's military 47 48 service information with the State Veterans Affairs Board, and determining the veteran's eligibility for the honorary high school 49 50 diploma, the State Board of Education may award the diploma to the 51 veteran.

52 (4) The State Board of Education is encouraged to provide 53 appropriate recognition, which may include special ceremonies, to 54 veterans who are awarded honorary high school diplomas under this 55 section.

56 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 57 and after July 1, 2001.
