HOUSE BILL NO. 440

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 55-15-51 THROUGH 55-15-62, 1 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI VETERANS 2 MONUMENT COMMISSION, PRESCRIBE ITS POWERS AND DUTIES AND ESTABLISH 3 THE VETERANS MONUMENT TRUST FUND; TO AMEND SECTION 55-15-63, 4 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND THE REPEAL DATE ON THE 5 REENACTED CODE SECTIONS FROM JULY 1, 2001, TO JULY 1, 2002; AND 6 7 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 55-15-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 9 10 reenacted as follows: 55-15-51. It is hereby found and determined by the 11 Legislature that many thousands of Mississippians have served in 12 the Armed Forces of the United States; that the Mississippi 13 veterans have not received the recognition and honor they deserve 14 15 for service to their country; and that an appropriate monument should be established and maintained as a symbol of the 16 17 recognition and appreciation of the State of Mississippi to Mississippi veterans. 18 SECTION 2. Section 55-15-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 19 20 reenacted as follows: 55-15-53. (1) From and after the effective date of Laws, 21 1977, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the present membership 22 23 of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall cease serving on the commission. From and after the effective date of 24 Laws, 1997, Chapter 466 [approved March 26, 1997] the Mississippi 25

26 Veterans Monument Commission shall consist of the following seven 27 (7) members:

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The Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 28 (a) 29 Memorial Commission, who shall serve as Secretary of the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission; 30 31 (b) The Executive Secretary of the State Veterans 32 Affairs Board; The Director of the Division of General Services in 33 (C) the Department of Finance and Administration; 34 (d) Three (3) members appointed by the Governor, one 35 (1) from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts as 36 37 follows: 38 (i) One (1) veteran of World War II; (ii) One (1) veteran of the Korean Conflict; and 39 One (1) veteran of the Vietnam Conflict; 40 (iii) (e) One (1) veteran of the Persian Gulf Conflict, 41 appointed from the state at large by the Lieutenant Governor. 42 The initial meeting of the commission shall be called (2) 43 and chaired by the Chairman of the Mississippi War Veterans 44 45 Memorial Commission, until the monument commission shall choose a chairman from among its members. Thereafter, the commission shall 46 47 elect a chairman each year, and the commission may meet at the call of the chairman once each month. Minutes of the meetings of 48 49 the commission shall be kept in a well-bound book and, along with 50 all other records and papers, shall remain in the custody of the secretary of the commission. A majority of the commission shall 51 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. All actions 52 taken or rules and regulations adopted by the commission shall be 53 54 by resolution duly spread upon its minutes, showing yea and nay votes of each member present. The signature of the chairman and 55 secretary, pursuant to a duly adopted resolution, shall be binding 56 57 upon the commission.

(3) The appointed members of the Mississippi Veterans
Monument Commission shall receive per diem compensation in the
amount authorized under Section 25-3-69 for each day or portion

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thereof spent in the performance of the duties of the commission 61 62 and shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses while on commission business as authorized under Section 25-3-41. Other 63 64 members of the commission shall not be entitled to compensation 65 but shall be entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses as 66 authorized under Section 25-3-41 while on commission business. Commission members shall be limited to reimbursement of travel 67 expenses and per diem compensation authorized herein for no more 68 than twelve (12) meetings per year. 69

(4) When the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission ceases
to exist, all records of the Mississippi Veterans Monument
Commission shall become the property of the Mississippi War
Veterans Memorial Commission.

(5) The Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission shall
have continuing oversight responsibility over all activities
pertaining to all Mississippi veterans monuments.

77 (6) The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission shall 78 continue in existence under the provisions of this chapter after the design, construction and dedication of the Mississippi 79 80 veterans monument for a period of one (1) year after the date on which the Mississippi veterans monument is officially dedicated so 81 82 that such commission can provide for the design, construction and dedication of future monuments to be located at sites designated 83 84 by the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission.

85 SECTION 3. Section 55-15-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 86 reenacted as follows:

55-15-55. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be constructed and maintained an appropriate monument to honor Mississippi veterans when adequate funds for the construction thereof are deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust Fund herein created.

92 SECTION 4. Section 55-15-57, Mississippi Code of 1972, is93 reenacted as follows:

96 (a) Plan and provide for the design, construction and
97 dedication of the Mississippi veterans monument. The actual
98 design and site of the monument shall be selected with the
99 approval of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History.

100 (b) Solicit private monetary donations for deposit into101 the Veterans Monument Trust Fund.

(c) Report to the Legislature by November 15 of each year on the progress of such monument. In addition to the report required in the preceding sentence, the commission shall submit an annual report on its activities no later than November of each year to the Military Affairs Committees of both the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Mississippi Senate.

108 SECTION 5. Section 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 109 reenacted as follows:

55-15-59. The Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission is 110 111 hereby authorized to accept gifts, grants and donations from individuals and organizations, to be deposited in the Veterans 112 113 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. The State Treasurer shall invest all monies in the Veterans 114 115 Monument Trust Fund and any interest earned shall be deposited into the fund. All funds deposited in the Veterans Monument Trust 116 Fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing, 117 118 erecting and maintaining the veterans monument, except that not more than Seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) may be 119 120 expended annually to pay the administrative costs of the commission. Any monies remaining unexpended or unencumbered in 121 the fund upon completion of the monument shall revert to the 122 Mississippi War Veterans Memorial Commission for maintenance of 123 124 the Veterans monument and memorials.

125 SECTION 6. Section 55-15-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 126 reenacted as follows:

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(1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 127 55-15-61. Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 128 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission 129 130 shall plan and provide for the design, construction and dedication 131 of a Mississippi Confederate memorial at the Shiloh National 132 Military Park. In planning the design, construction and dedication of the memorial, the commission shall consult with and 133 be advised by an advisory committee composed of three (3) 134 135 representatives from the Mississippi Department of the Sons of Confederate Veterans. The Mississippi Department of the Sons of 136 137 Confederate Veterans shall designate such representatives and certify them to the commission. The commission shall solicit 138 private monetary donations for deposit into a Shiloh Confederate 139 Memorial Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 140 Private donations to the trust fund may be matched by the state 141 using any appropriations made for that purpose by the Legislature; 142 however, any state match shall not exceed One Hundred Fifty 143 144 Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) in the aggregate. The commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust fund 145 146 grants or donations made to it from any other source. All funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the 147 148 purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the monument.

(2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the Shiloh Confederate Memorial Trust Fund.

154 SECTION 7. Section 55-15-62, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 155 reenacted as follows:

156 55-15-62. (1) In addition to the duties assigned to the 157 Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission in Sections 55-15-55, 158 55-15-57 and 55-15-59, Mississippi Code of 1972, the commission is 159 hereby authorized, subject to any available funds, to plan and

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provide for the design, construction and dedication of a monument 160 recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of 161 In planning the design, construction and dedication of the 162 Honor. 163 monument, the commission shall consult with and be advised by the 164 State Veterans Affairs Board. The commission may solicit private monetary donations for deposit into a Congressional Medal of Honor 165 Monument Trust Fund which is hereby created in the State Treasury. 166 167 Private donations to the trust fund may be accepted. The commission is also authorized to accept for deposit into the trust 168 fund grants or donations made to it from any other source. 169 All 170 funds deposited in the trust fund shall be used exclusively for the purpose of designing, constructing and maintaining the 171 172 monument.

173 (2) The board of supervisors of any county and the governing 174 authorities of any municipality are hereby authorized and 175 empowered, in their discretion, to make contributions out of any 176 available county or municipal funds, as appropriate, to the 177 Congressional Medal of Honor Monument Trust Fund.

178 SECTION 8. Section 55-15-63, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 179 amended as follows:

180 55-15-63. Sections 55-15-51 through 55-15-61, Mississippi
181 Code of 1972, which create and empower the Mississippi Veterans
182 Monument Commission, are repealed from and after July 1, 2002.
183 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from
184 and after July 1, 2001.
