HOUSE BILL NO. 496

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-83, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO PLACE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS IN 2 3 EVERY CLASSROOM AND ON EVERY SCHOOL BUS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-3-83, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 37-3-83. (1) There is established within the State 7 Department of Education a school violence prevention grant 8 program, available to all eligible public school districts, to 9 assist in financing programs to fight school violence. 10 Subject to the extent of appropriations available, the 11 (2)school violence prevention grant program shall offer any of the 12 13 following specific preventive services and other additional services appropriate to school violence prevention: 14 (a) Metal detectors; 15 (b) Video surveillance cameras and monitoring equipment 16 for classrooms * * * and school buses, as required under 17 subsection (4) of this section; 18 Crisis management/action teams for the purpose of 19 (C) 20 responding to school violence; and 21 (d) Violence prevention training, conflict resolution 22 training and other appropriate training designated by the State Department of Education for faculty and staff. 23 (3) Each local school district in this state may * * * apply 24 annually for up to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) in school 25 violence prevention grant funds, subject to the extent of 26 appropriations specifically therefor by the Legislature. In order 27

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to be eligible for such program, each local school board desiring 28 to participate shall apply to the State Department of Education by 29 May 31 before the beginning of the applicable fiscal year on forms 30 provided by the department, and shall be required to establish a 31 32 local school Violence Task Force to involve members of the 33 community in the school violence prevention effort. The State Department of Education shall determine by July 1 of each 34 succeeding fiscal year which local school districts have 35 submitted * * * applications for school violence prevention grants 36 which have been approved by the department. 37

38 (4) <u>Before July 1, 2002, each local school district shall</u>
39 <u>install video surveillance camera equipment in every classroom and</u>
40 <u>on every school bus for the purpose of monitoring school</u>
41 <u>disciplinary problems. A school district may use school violence</u>
42 <u>prevention grant funds or any other available funds for the</u>
43 <u>purchase of video surveillance camera equipment and monitoring</u>

44 <u>equipment.</u>

45 <u>(5)</u> The State Department of Education <u>shall</u> research the 46 <u>effectiveness</u> of using video <u>surveillance</u> camera equipment in the 47 classroom <u>and on school buses</u>. <u>The department shall</u> address the 48 following <u>issues</u>:

49 (a) <u>The effectiveness of</u> video cameras in the classroom
 50 <u>and on school buses in reducing</u> student disciplinary problems;

51 (b) <u>The effectiveness of</u> teachers <u>and bus drivers using</u> 52 <u>the cameras</u> to present clear and convincing evidence of a 53 student's disruptive behavior to the student, the principal, the 54 superintendent and the student's parents; and

55 (c) <u>The effectiveness of</u> teachers <u>using the cameras</u> to 56 review teaching performance and receive diagnostic feedback for 57 developmental purposes.

58 The results of <u>the department's research</u> shall be reported <u>in</u> 59 <u>a study</u> to the Chairmen of the Education Committees in the House 60 of Representatives and Senate by <u>January 1, 2003.</u>

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61 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 62 and after July 1, 2001.
