HOUSE BILL NO. 502

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO PROVIDE THAT A PERSON WHO IS CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION OF THE 3 LAW SETTING ASIDE SPECIAL PARKING AREAS FOR PERSONS WHO ARE 4 DISABLED SHALL NOT BE CONVICTED FOR FAILING TO DISPLAY A SPECIAL 5 WINDSHIELD PLACARD UPON PRESENTATION TO THE COURT OF PROOF THAT AT 6 THE TIME OF THE CHARGED VIOLATION HE OR A PASSENGER IN THE VEHICLE 7 POSSESSED A VALID PLACARD; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

11 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the 12 State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 13 ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 14 through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 15 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on 16 Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 17 18 that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 19 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of 20 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 21 walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 22 23 will have the disability for at least three (3) years. The State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of 24 the various counties, decals for placement on the special license 25 plates. The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the 26 license plate was issued and the year in which the special license 27 28 plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this

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section is valid for the period of time that the license tag 29 30 attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 31 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued 32 may retain the special license plate and may renew it by 33 submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its 34 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the 35 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs 36 the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the 37 38 disability for at least three (3) years. If an applicant fails to 39 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration, then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county 40 41 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a 42 regular license plate to replace the special license plate. The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this 43

44 section, includes motorcycles.

The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons who, as determined by a licensed physician:

48 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping49 to rest; or

50 (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
51 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
52 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or

(c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1) liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60) mm/hg on room air at rest; or

58 (d) Use portable oxygen; or

(e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that theperson's functional limitations are classified in severity as

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63 (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due64 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.

An applicant for a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

71 The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable (2)windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and 72 73 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with 74 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The 75 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through 76 the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial 77 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 78 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 79 80 These placards shall be valid for a period of three (3) walk. 81 years from their date of issue and may be renewed in the same 82 manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates under subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield 83 84 placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle 85 dashboard. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement 86 for motorcycles.

87 (3) The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance 88 of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability 89 Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by 90 to walk. 91 this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and 92 shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 93 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a *HR03/R555*

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94 temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 95 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 96 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the 97 ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 98 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 99 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 100 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard. The temporary removable windshield placard 101 102 shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has 103 determined that the applicant will have the disability, not to 104 exceed six (6) months from the date of issuance. The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 105

106 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary 107 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:

(a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be white on a red shield);

(b) An identification number and, on the reverse side,the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;

(c) A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the placard by the tax collector; and

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(d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.

118 (5) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an (a) area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle 119 120 does not have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in this section. Any person who unlawfully parks a 121 motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks such spaces or access 122 thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction 123 124 thereof, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars 125 (\$200.00) for each such violation. 127 be suspended for ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public 128 Safety in accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine 129 imposed. The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required 130 to be imposed under this subsection.

131 (b) A person who is charged with a violation of this 132 section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for persons who are disabled and failing properly to display a 133 134 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall have the charge dismissed upon presentation 135 to the court of proof that at the time of the charged violation he 136 137 or a passenger in the vehicle possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this section. 138

(6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

(7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce 145 146 this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces 147 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such 148 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce such designated parking on private property. Only areas marked in 149 150 accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility 151 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces shall bear the International Symbol of Access. 152

153 (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 154 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 155 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 156 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 157 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges 158 under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard,

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(9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk. The identification required to park in such an area, except as provided in subsection (8) of this act, is as follows:

167 (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a
168 permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard
169 must be displayed.

(b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk, or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary windshield placard must be displayed.

174 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 175 and after July 1, 2001.
