## HOUSE BILL NO. 535

AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM 1 EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING SCHOOL COUNSELORS 2 FOR GRADES K-8; TO PROVIDE AN ADDITIONAL ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS IN EACH SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR UNTIL EACH PRIMARY SCHOOL HAS EMPLOYED 3 4 AT LEAST ONE COUNSELOR; TO AUTHORIZE LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS TO ASSIGN 5 SCHOOL COUNSELORS TO PARTICULAR SCHOOLS; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE 6 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EMPLOY A SUPERVISOR OF COUNSELORS AND 7 TO ISSUE REGULATIONS REGARDING THE SERVICES OF SUCH COUNSELORS; 8 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 2001-2002 school year, in 11 addition to other funds allotted under the minimum education 12 program, each school district shall be allotted sufficient funding 13 to employ one (1) school counselor for students in Kindergarten 14 through Grade 8, with funding for an additional school counselor 15 16 to be allotted per fiscal year until each primary school in the school district has one (1) state-funded counselor. However, 17 until the time that there is a counselor in every primary school 18 at a counselor:student ratio of 1:500 or greater, the annual 19 appropriation for counselors may not be reduced. 20

(2) The State Department of Education may increase the
number of positions funded each year beyond the above requirements
as money is made available.

(3) The assignment of the school counselors to the
particular schools shall be at the discretion of the local school
district with the following restrictions:

(a) The counselor:student ratio may not be less than
1:500, or one (1) counselor per school building, whichever is
greater.

30 (b) An individual may not be employed as a school
31 counselor without appropriate training and certification as a
32 school counselor by the State Department of Education.

33 (4) To qualify for minimum program funding, school 34 counselors must be full-time professional personnel, must spend at 35 least seventy-five percent (75%) of work time in a direct 36 counseling relationship with pupils, and must devote no more than 37 one-fourth (1/4) of the work day to administrative activities that 38 are counselor related.

39 (5) This act does not prohibit any school district from
40 employing with local funds more school counselors than are
41 provided for in this act.

(6) The State Department of Education shall employ a
supervisor of counselors who holds certification as a school
counselor. The supervisor's responsibilities shall include the
oversight of the new primary school counseling programs as well as
existing secondary programs.

(7) The State Department of Education may adopt rules and regulations regarding the activities of the school counselor, and the school counselor may perform such services that are not inconsistent with the rules and regulations.

51 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 52 and after July 1, 2001.
