HOUSE BILL NO. 542

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 35-3-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE CRITERIA FOR SELECTING COUNTY VETERAN SERVICE OFFICERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 35-3-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 35-3-21. In order to maintain offices and pay personnel for
- 8 the purpose of assisting all residents of the State of Mississippi
- 9 who served in the military or naval forces of the United States
- 10 during any war, their relatives, beneficiaries or dependents, to
- 11 receive from the United States any and all compensation,
- 12 hospitalization, insurance or other aid or benefits to which they
- 13 may be entitled under existing or hereafter enacted laws of the
- 14 United States, the boards of supervisors in the various counties
- 15 in the state are hereby authorized and empowered, in their
- 16 discretion, to expend out of the general county fund, or special
- 17 veterans' fund herein authorized to be set up, or from both of
- 18 such funds, such monies necessary to defray the office operating
- 19 expenses and salary of the county veteran service officers.
- Two (2) or more counties may, upon resolution duly adopted by
- 21 the board of supervisors of each of such counties, agree to
- 22 establish one (1) veteran service office for all of such counties.
- 23 When two (2) or more counties enter into such an agreement, each
- 24 county shall pay such amount mutually agreed upon and duly adopted
- 25 by resolution of the respective boards of supervisors.
- 26 County veteran service officers shall be selected in the
- 27 following order: (a) honorably discharged or honorably released

veterans of any war or police action in which the Armed Forces of 28 29 the United States have been, are or shall be committed for action, with first preference going to disabled American Veterans 30 according to their percent of disability, with the highest percent 31 32 of disability controlling followed by veterans without disability; 33 (b) the surviving spouse or child of any such deceased veteran; or (c) any person employed as a county veteran service officer in any 34 county of this state on March 30, 1990. From and after July 1, 35 1990, county veteran service officers shall be certified by the 36 Mississippi State Veterans' Affairs Board which, among any other 37 criteria it may establish, shall require such officers to (a) 38 attend at least one (1) of the two (2) annual training programs 39 40 provided for such officers and (b) successfully complete a written examination each year on the duties and responsibilities of and 41 assistance available to such officers and veterans. The programs 42 shall be developed by the State Veterans' Affairs Board. 43 program shall include a period of instruction which shall be not 44 45 more than three (3) days for veteran service officers receiving initial certification, and not more than two (2) days for veteran 46 47 service officers being recertified. County veteran service officers who annually receive and complete such instruction in a 48 49 manner satisfactory to the Veterans' Affairs Board and in accordance with this section shall be certified by the board. 50 No county veteran service officer shall be entitled to receive any 51 52 compensation for his services, to which he is otherwise entitled by law, unless he is annually certified by the board. 53 54 County veteran service officers may be employed, in the discretion of the boards of supervisors, either full time or part 55 time, but may not hold any other elective or appointive position. 56 However, this paragraph shall not apply to county veteran service 57 58 officers who may be serving in such capacity before March 31, 59 1990.

60	The boards of supervisors of the various counties are further
61	authorized and empowered to pay all necessary and actual expenses
62	of county veteran service officers who attend a school of
63	instruction within the State of Mississippi for such county
64	veteran service officers.

- It shall also be the duty of the boards of supervisors to aid 65 the United States to defeat all unjust claims for aid or benefit 66 therefrom. 67
- Such expenditures may be made by the several counties acting 68 alone, or in cooperation with other counties, and in cooperation 69 70 with any federal or state agency carrying out such purposes.
 - In the event that the general revenues of the county levied under and within the limits of existing taxing statutes are not sufficient to pay the expenses authorized herein, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, levy an additional tax not to exceed one (1) mill on all taxable property in the county to defray such expenses or any part thereof. Any tax levy made under authority of this chapter shall not be considered in refunding homestead exemption losses under Title 27, Chapter 33, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 80 81 and after July 1, 2001.

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
