1 2 3 4 5 6	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-3-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE OFFICE OF EDUCATIONAL ACCOUNTABILITY TO COMPILE AND INCLUDE IN THE MISSISSIPPI REPORT CARD DATA REFLECTING SCHOOL DISTRICTS' SPENDING FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES COMPARED TO SPENDING FOR NONEDUCATIONAL PURPOSES AND SPENDING ON CLASSROOM TECHNOLOGY COMPARED TO TOTAL DISTRICT SPENDING; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 37-3-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:
10	37-3-53. (1) Each school year, the State Board of
11	Education, acting through the Office of Educational
12	Accountability, shall develop a public school reporting system, or
13	"Mississippi Report Card," on the performance of students and
14	schools at the local, district and state level. In developing the
15	report card, the Office of Educational Accountability shall
16	collect school, district and state level student achievement data
17	in the appropriate grades as designated by the State Board of
18	Education in all core subjects, and compare the data with national
19	standards to identify students' strengths and weaknesses. The
20	Mississippi Report Card shall provide more than reports to parents
21	on the level at which their children are performing; the report
22	shall provide clear and comparable public information on the level
23	at which schools, school districts and the state public education
24	system are performing. The Office of Educational Accountability
25	shall encourage local school districts and the general public to
26	use Mississippi Report Card information along with local
27	individual student data to assess the quality of instructional
28	programs and the performance of schools and to plan and implement
29	programs of instructional improvement.

31 information, as compiled by the Office of Compulsory School Attendance Enforcement, which demonstrates clearly the absenteeism 32 and dropout rates in each school district and the state and 33 34 whether those rates reflect a positive or negative change from the 35 same information as reported in the previous year's Mississippi Report Card. 36 (3) (a) The Office of Educational Accountability shall 37 require each school district to annually submit a report to the 38 office comparing the district's spending for educational purposes 39 40 with spending for noneducational purposes. The report must reflect total spending in the district without regard to the 41 source of funds. In order to assure uniformity among the reports 42 from the various school districts, the Office of Educational 43 44 Accountability shall promulgate reporting guidelines that specifically define the components of the terms "educational 45 purposes and "noneducational purposes." Data compiled from the 46 reports must be included in the Mississippi Report Card in a ratio 47 format that reflects each school district's spending for 48 49 educational purposes compared to spending for noneducational purposes. In addition, the Office of Educational Accountability 50 51 shall assign a performance indicator to each school district's 52 spending ratio which may be used to compare spending patterns 53 among the various school districts. 54 (b) A school district shall include in the report required under this subsection data comparing the district's 55 56 spending on classroom technology to the district's total spending. The Office of Educational Accountability shall define the specific 57 components of the term "classroom technology." A ratio reflecting 58 each school district's spending for classroom technology purposes, 59 60 in comparison to total spending in the district, and a performance 61 indicator assigned by the Office of Educational Accountability must be included in the Mississippi Report Card. 62
