HOUSE BILL NO. 678

AN ACT TO CREATE A NEW CODE SECTION TO BE CODIFIED AS SECTION 1 3-3-32, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DESIGNATE "MISSISSIPPI, THE PROMISED LAND" AS THE OFFICIAL STATE BALLAD; AND FOR RELATED 2 3 4 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section 6 3-3-32, Mississippi Code of 1972: 7 3-3-32. The ballad "Mississippi, The Promised Land," by Paul 8 9 Robertson and Paul Ott, copyrighted 1969, is hereby designated as the state ballad of Mississippi.
