HOUSE BILL NO. 682

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-41, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT PERSONS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR OR LIEUTENANT 2 GOVERNOR TO A BOARD, COMMISSION OR OTHER POSITION THAT REQUIRES 3 CONFIRMATION BY THE SENATE MAY RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR MILEAGE 4 AND OTHER ACTUAL EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF OFFICIAL 5 DUTIES BEFORE SUCH APPOINTMENT IS CONFIRMED BY THE SENATE; TO б AMEND SECTION 25-3-69, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT 7 PERSONS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR OR LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR TO A 8 BOARD, COMMISSION OR OTHER POSITION THAT REQUIRES CONFIRMATION BY 9 THE SENATE MAY RECEIVE PER DIEM COMPENSATION FOR THE PERFORMANCE 10 OF OFFICIAL DUTIES BEFORE SUCH APPOINTMENT IS CONFIRMED BY THE 11 12 SENATE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

16 25-3-41. (1) When any officer or employee of the State of Mississippi, or any department, agency or institution thereof, 17 18 after first being duly authorized, is required to travel in the performance of his official duties, such officer or employee shall 19 20 receive as expenses for each mile actually and necessarily traveled, when such travel is done by a privately owned automobile 21 22 or other privately owned motor vehicle, the mileage reimbursement 23 rate allowable to federal employees for the use of a privately owned vehicle while on official travel. 24

25 (2) When any officer or employee of any county or municipality, or of any agency, board or commission thereof, after 26 first being duly authorized, is required to travel in the 27 performance of his official duties, such officer or employee shall 28 29 receive as expenses Twenty Cents (20¢) for each mile actually and 30 necessarily traveled, when such travel is done by a privately owned motor vehicle; provided, however, that the governing 31 *HR03/R491* H. 32 authorities of a county or municipality may, in their discretion, 33 authorize an increase in the mileage reimbursement of officers and 34 employees of such county or municipality, or of any agency, board 35 or commission thereof, in an amount not to exceed the mileage 36 reimbursement rate authorized for officers and employees of the 37 State of Mississippi in subsection (1) of this section.

38 (3) Where two (2) or more officers or employees travel in 39 one (1) privately owned motor vehicle, only one (1) travel expense 40 allowance at the authorized rate per mile shall be allowed for any 41 one (1) trip. When such travel is done by means of a public 42 carrier or other means not involving a privately owned motor 43 vehicle, then such officer or employee shall receive as travel 44 expense the actual fare or other expenses incurred in such travel.

45 (4) In addition to the foregoing, a public officer or employee shall be reimbursed for other actual expenses such as 46 meals, lodging and other necessary expenses incurred in the course 47 48 of such travel, subject to limitations placed on meals for 49 intrastate and interstate official travel by the Department of Finance and Administration, provided, that the Legislative Budget 50 51 Office shall place any limitations for expenditures made on matters under the jurisdiction of the Legislature. 52 The Department 53 of Finance and Administration shall set a maximum daily expenditure annually for such meals and shall notify officers and 54 55 employees of changes to these allowances immediately upon approval 56 of such changes. Travel by airline shall be at the tourist rate 57 unless such space was unavailable. The officer or employee shall 58 certify that tourist accommodations were not available if travel is performed in first class airline accommodations. 59 Itemized expense accounts shall be submitted by such officers or employees 60 in such number as the department, agency or institution may 61 62 require; but in any case one (1) copy shall be furnished by state 63 departments, agencies or institutions to the Department of Finance and Administration for preaudit or postaudit. 01/HR03/R491 PAGE 2 (PBR\LH) 65 Finance and Administration shall promulgate and adopt reasonable 66 rules and regulations which it deems necessary and requisite to 67 effectuate economies for all expenses authorized and paid pursuant 68 to this section. Requisitions shall be made on the State Fiscal 69 Officer who shall issue his warrant on the State Treasurer. 70 Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not include agencies financed entirely by federal funds and audited by 71 72 federal auditors.

Any officer or employee of a county or municipality, or 73 (5) 74 any department, board or commission thereof, who is required to 75 travel in the performance of his official duties, may receive 76 funds prior to such travel, in the discretion of the 77 administrative head of the county or municipal department, board 78 or commission involved, for the purpose of paying necessary 79 expenses incurred during such travel. Upon return from such travel, the officer or employee shall provide receipts of 80 transportation, lodging, meals, fees and any other expenses 81 82 incurred during the travel. Any portion of the funds advanced which is not expended during the travel shall be returned by the 83 84 officer or employee. The Department of Audit shall adopt rules and regulations regarding advance payment of travel expenses and 85 submission of receipts to ensure proper control and strict 86 87 accountability for such payments and expenses.

No state or federal funds received from any source by 88 (6) 89 any arm or agency of the state shall be expended in traveling outside of the continental limits of the United States until the 90 91 governing body or head of the agency makes a finding and determination that the travel would be extremely beneficial to the 92 state agency and obtains a written concurrence thereof from the 93 Governor or his designee and the Department of Finance and 94 95 Administration.

96 (7) Where any officer or employee of the State of 97 Mississippi, or any department, agency or institution thereof, or H. B. No. 682 *HRO3/R491* 01/HR03/R491 PAGE 3 (PBR\LH) 98 of any county or municipality, or of any agency, board or 99 commission thereof, is authorized to receive travel reimbursement 100 under any other provision of law, such reimbursement may be paid 101 under the provisions of this section or such other section, but 102 not under both.

103 (8) When the Governor or Lieutenant Governor appoints a
104 person to a board, commission or other position that requires
105 confirmation by the Senate, the person may receive reimbursement
106 for mileage and other actual expenses incurred in the performance
107 of official duties before such appointment is confirmed by the
108 Senate, as reimbursement for such expenses is authorized under
109 this section.

110 The Department of Finance and Administration may (9) (a) contract with one or more commercial travel agencies, after 111 receiving competitive bids or proposals therefor, for such travel 112 agency or agencies to provide necessary travel services for state 113 114 officers and employees. However, the administrative head of each 115 state institution of higher learning may, in his discretion, contract with a commercial travel agency to provide necessary 116 117 travel services for all academic officials and staff of the university in lieu of participation in the state travel agency 118 119 contract. Any such decision by a university to contract with a 120 separate travel agency shall be approved by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Executive 121 122 Director of the Department of Finance and Administration.

Before executing a contract with one or more travel 123 (b) 124 agencies, the Department of Finance and Administration shall advertise for competitive bids or proposals once a week for two 125 126 (2) consecutive weeks in a regular newspaper having a general circulation throughout the State of Mississippi. If the department 127 128 determines that it should not contract with any of the bidders 129 initially submitting proposals, the department may reject all such bids, advertise as provided herein and receive new proposals 130 *HR03/R491* H. 131 before executing the contract or contracts. The contract or 132 contracts may be for a period not greater than three (3) years, 133 with an option for the travel agency or agencies to renew the 134 contract or contracts on a one-year basis on the same terms as the 135 original contract or contracts, for a maximum of two (2) renewals. 136 After the travel agency or agencies have renewed the contract twice or have declined to renew the contract for the maximum 137 number of times, the Department of Finance and Administration 138 139 shall advertise for bids in the manner required by this section and execute a new contract or contracts. 140

141 (c) Whenever any state officer or employee travels in 142 the performance of his official duties by airline or other public 143 carrier, he shall have his travel arrangements handled by such 144 travel agency or agencies.

145 SECTION 2. Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 146 amended as follows:

25-3-69. Unless otherwise provided by law, all officers and 147 148 employees of state agencies, boards, commissions, departments and institutions authorized by law to receive per diem compensation 149 150 for each day or fraction thereof occupied with the discharge of official duties shall be entitled to Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per 151 152 diem compensation. When the Governor or Lieutenant Governor 153 appoints a person to a board, commission or other position that requires confirmation by the Senate, the person may receive per 154 155 diem compensation for the performance of official duties before such appointment is confirmed by the Senate, as such per diem 156 157 compensation is authorized under this section.

158 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 159 and after July 1, 2001.
