## HOUSE BILL NO. 861

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 75-75-101 AND 75-75-105, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE AND CLARIFY LAWS RELATING TO THE CONDUCT 3 OF TOUGH-MAN CONTESTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 75-75-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

75-75-101. (1) Boxing, sparring and wrestling matches and 7 exhibitions for percentage of gate receipts where an admission fee 8 is charged are hereby allowed. All boxing, sparring and wrestling 9 matches and exhibitions authorized herein shall be held under the 10 supervision of and subject to the rules and regulations of the 11 Mississippi Athletic Commission, and in strict compliance with the 12 13 provisions of this article. No boxing or sparring match or exhibition shall exceed fifteen (15) rounds of three (3) minutes 14 each, and the charge for each seat or ticket shall be left to the 15 discretion of the commission. 16

17 (2) For the purposes of this chapter, "tough-man contest"
18 and kickboxing competition shall be subject to the jurisdiction of
19 the Mississippi Athletic Commission.

(3) (a) Promoters of tough-man contests are authorized to
 use licensed judges and referees of their choice. The Mississippi
 Athletic Commission shall not require such promoters to use judges
 and referees selected by the commission.

(b) Tough-man contest fighters shall use gloves which
 are weighted at fourteen (14) ounce or larger.

26 (c) A tough-man contest shall not exceed three (3)
27 rounds and a round shall be for two (2) minutes. No fighter shall

fight more than two (2) consecutive days with a maximum of twelve 28

29 (12) rounds.

Tough-man contest matches that are part of a 30 (d)

tournament or other competition lasting at least two (2) days 31

32 shall require prefight physicals of all contestants not more than

33 four (4) hours before the start of such tournament or other

34 competition.

SECTION 2. Section 75-75-105, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 35 amended as follows: 36

75-75-105. The commission shall have a seal and shall have 37 and is hereby vested with the sole direction, management, control 38 and jurisdiction over all boxing, sparring and wrestling matches 39 40 or exhibitions to be conducted, held or given within the State of Mississippi. The commission has full power and authority and it 41 shall be its duty: (a) to make and publish rules and regulations 42 governing the conduct of boxing, sparring and wrestling matches 43 44 and exhibitions, the time and place thereof, and the prices 45 charged for admission thereto; (b) to accept application for and, in its discretion, order a license or permit issued to promoters 46 47 and participants of these events, and to revoke the license or permit; (c) to collect through the recorder of permits and 48 49 licenses a fee of six percent (6%) of the gross receipts of every boxing, sparring or wrestling match or exhibition, and a 50 reasonable fee not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for 51 52 each annual license or permit issued to a boxer, wrestler, referee, judge, matchmaker, promoter, manager, trainer, second, 53 54 director, or timekeeper; and (d) to revoke any license or permit when, in its judgment, the public welfare requires it. 55 The commission is prohibited from issuing regulations which may be 56 construed as granting a franchised or exclusive territory, and 57 58 from the issuing of any type of monopolistic license or permit. 59

The commission shall not make any rules or regulations governing

60 the conduct of tough-man contests that conflict with the

- 61 provisions of Section 75-75-101, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 62 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 63 and after July 1, 2001.
