- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 7-5-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- amended as follows: 7
- 7-5-7. The Governor may engage counsel to assist the 8
- 9 Attorney General in cases to which the state is a party when, in
- his opinion, the interest of the state requires it, subject to the 10
- action of the Legislature in providing compensation for such 11
- 12 services.

- The Attorney General is hereby authorized and empowered to 13
- appoint and employ special counsel, on a fee or salary basis, to 14
- assist the Attorney General in the preparation for, prosecution, 15
- or defense of any litigation in the state or federal courts or 16
- before any federal commission or agency in which the state is a 17
- 18 party or has an interest.
- The Attorney General may designate such special counsel as 19
- special assistant attorney general, and may pay such special 20
- counsel reasonable compensation to be agreed upon by the Attorney 21
- General and such special counsel, in no event to exceed recognized 22
- bar rates for similar services. 23
- The Attorney General may also employ special investigators on 24
- a per diem or salary basis, to be agreed upon at the time of 25
- 26 employment, for the purpose of interviewing witnesses,
- ascertaining facts, or rendering any other services that may be 27
- needed by the Attorney General in the preparation for and 28

- 29 prosecution of suits by or against the State of Mississippi, or in
- 30 suits in which the Attorney General is participating on account of
- 31 same being of statewide interest. Each investigator who retires
- 32 <u>under the Public Employees' Retirement System shall be allowed to</u>
- 33 retain, as his personal property, one (1) sidearm which was issued
- 34 by the Attorney General.
- 35 The Attorney General may pay travel and other expenses of
- 36 employees and appointees made hereunder in the same manner and
- 37 amount as authorized by law for the payment of travel and expenses
- 38 of state employees and officials.
- The compensation of appointees and employees made hereunder
- 40 shall be paid out of the Attorney General's Contingent Fund, or
- 41 out of any other funds appropriated to the Attorney General's
- 42 Office.
- SECTION 2. Any law enforcement officer of a state-supported
- 44 institution of higher learning who retires under any state
- 45 retirement system or any state-approved retirement system may be
- 46 allowed to purchase as his personal property one (1) sidearm which
- 47 was issued to him. The institution of higher learning for which
- 48 such law enforcement officer was employed shall determine the
- 49 amount to be paid by the retiring law enforcement officer.
- 50 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 51 and after July 1, 2001.
