HOUSE BILL NO. 1091

1	AN ACT TO REQUIRE PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS TO SUCCESSFULLY
2	COMPLETE CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSCITATION (CPR) TRAINING AS A
3	CONDITION FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION; TO AMEND SECTIONS 37-13-131
4	AND 37-13-151, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE
5	COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM AND A COURSE OFFERED
6	THROUGH THE HOME ECONOMICS PROGRAM TO INCLUDE CPR TRAINING; AND
7	FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 <u>SECTION 1.</u> In addition to all other requirements for
- 10 graduation prescribed by the State Board of Education and local
- 11 school boards, a student must successfully complete training in
- 12 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in a high school as a
- 13 condition for graduation from a public high school in Mississippi.
- SECTION 2. Section 37-13-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 15 amended as follows:
- 16 37-13-131. (1) The State Department of Education is
- 17 designated as the state agency responsible for the administration
- 18 and supervision of the Comprehensive School Health Education
- 19 Program as an educational curriculum in the State of Mississippi.
- 20 It is the intent of the Legislature that all funds made available
- 21 to the State Department of Education for the purpose of
- 22 comprehensive school health education shall be administered by the
- 23 State Department of Education.
- 24 (2) Pursuant to the provisions of subsection (1) of this
- 25 section, the State Department of Education is authorized to
- 26 establish an Office of Comprehensive School Health Education
- 27 within the framework of the State Department of Education for the
- 28 purpose of developing standards, procedures and criteria for the

- 30 education in Kindergarten through Grade 12. The State Department
- 31 of Education, through the Office of Comprehensive School Health
- 32 Education, shall assume the further responsibility for promoting a
- 33 statewide effort designed to prepare local school faculties and
- 34 staffs to incorporate the comprehensive health education concept
- 35 into their local educational programs.
- 36 (3) The Mississippi Department of Health, in conjunction
- 37 with the Office of Student Development-Branch of Health-Related
- 38 Services of the State Department of Education, shall develop a
- 39 long-range strategic plan for a Comprehensive School Health
- 40 Education Program in Grades K through 12. The Comprehensive
- 41 School Health Education Program shall encompass four (4)
- 42 interdependent components: (a) health education; (b) health
- 43 service, including training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 44 (CPR); (c) physical education and fitness; and (d) a healthful
- 45 school environment. These curriculum components shall be designed
- 46 to develop decision-making competencies related to health and
- 47 health behavior. Such curriculum components are intended to
- 48 motivate health maintenance and promote wellness, not only to
- 49 prevent disease or disability. The Mississippi Department of
- 50 Health, in conjunction with the Office of Student
- 51 Development-Branch of Health-Related Services of the Department of
- 52 Education, shall develop the strategic plan * * *.
- 53 SECTION 3. Section 37-13-151, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 54 amended as follows:
- 55 37-13-151. * * * All local school districts shall provide
- 56 programs of education in home economics, in Grade 10, 11 or 12,
- 57 which include course work in responsible parenting and family
- 58 living skills. These programs shall contain instruction to
- 59 prepare students to understand children's physical, mental,
- 60 emotional and social growth and development as well as to assume
- 61 responsibility for their care and guidance, with emphasis and

- 62 training on nutrition, emotional health, physical health and
- 63 cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR). All such programs shall be
- 64 subject to the approval of the State Board of Education pursuant
- 65 to Section 37-31-205(1)(d).
- SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 67 and after July 1, 2001.
