HOUSE BILL NO. 1111

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE EVERY PERSON, UPON EACH RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE, TO 2 TAKE AND PASS A VISION SCREENING EXAMINATION TO BE ADMINISTERED BY 3 THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 7 63-1-47. (1) Each applicant for an original license issued 8 pursuant to this article, who is entitled to issuance of same, and 9 10 who is eighteen (18) years of age or older, shall be issued a four-year license. Each license will expire at midnight on the 11 licensee's birthday. 12 13 (a) All renewal licenses of operators eighteen (18) 14 years of age or older shall be for four-year periods and may be 15 renewed any time within six (6) months before the expiration of the license upon application and payment of the required fee, 16 17 unless required to be reexamined. Every person seventy (70) years of age or older, 18 (b) upon each renewal of a driver's license, and in addition to 19 20 complying with all other requirements for the renewal of a driver's license, must take and pass a vision screening 21 examination to be administered by the Department of Public Safety. 22 No additional fee shall be charged by the department for 23 administering such examination. 24 25 (c) From and after January 1, 1990, no commercial driver's license shall be issued under the provisions of this 26 27 article for any commercial motor vehicle, the lawful operation of

No. 1111 \*HR40/R1430\* 01/HR40/R1430 PAGE 1 (JWB\BD) 28 which requires the driver to obtain a Class A, B or C commercial 29 driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; however, from 30 time to time, the holder of a commercial license may apply for a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; and, 31 32 if he fails to pass the required test for such license, he shall be entitled to an extension of his license that shall be valid for 33 34 one hundred twenty (120) days or until he again is tested under Article 2 of this chapter, whichever occurs first. The extension 35 shall entitle the license holder to operate all vehicles which 36 37 such license authorized him to operate prior to taking the 38 required test. The first extension shall be without charge; however, a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) shall be imposed for 39 40 any subsequent extension. No extension shall be valid past March 41 31, 1992.

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Any commercial driver's license issued under this 43 (2) 44 article before January 1, 1990, which expires after March 31, 45 1992, shall be void on April 1, 1992, for the operation of any commercial vehicle requiring a commercial license to be issued 46 47 under Article 2 of this chapter; however, if the holder of any such license applies for a commercial driver's license under 48 49 Article 2 of this chapter, passes the required tests for such license, pays all applicable fees under Article 2 of this chapter 50 except the Forty Dollars (\$40.00) license fee and otherwise meets 51 all requirements for the issuance of such license, then such 52 person shall be issued a license under Article 2 of this chapter 53 54 which shall expire on the expiration date of the commercial 55 driver's license being replaced.

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57 (3) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify, by 58 United States mail addressed to the last known address of record 59 with the Department of Public Safety, all holders of commercial 60 driver's licenses issued under this article before January 1, H. No. 1111 \*HR40/R1430\* 01/HR40/R1430 PAGE 2 (JWB\BD) 61 1990, and which expire after March 31, 1992, that such licenses 62 will be void on and after April 1, 1992, for the operation of any 63 vehicle for which a commercial driver's license is required to be 64 issued under Article 2 of this chapter.

Any person holding a valid commercial driver's license 65 (4) 66 issued under this article before January 1, 1990, shall continue thereafter, until expiration of such license, to be entitled to 67 operate all vehicles which such license authorized him to operate 68 immediately before January 1, 1990, except that from and after 69 70 April 1, 1992, such license shall not entitle the licensee to 71 operate a commercial motor vehicle the lawful operation of which 72 requires a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this 73 chapter.

74 Except as otherwise provided in this article, each (5) applicant for an original driver's license issued pursuant to this 75 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, being under eighteen 76 77 (18) years of age, shall be issued a one-year license which will 78 expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. Renewal driver's licenses of operators under the age of eighteen (18) shall be for 79 80 one-year periods and may be renewed any time within two (2) months 81 before the expiration of the license upon application and payment 82 of the required fee, unless required to be reexamined. An intermediate license shall be valid for one (1) year from its date 83 84 of issue and may be renewed any time within fourteen (14) days 85 before expiration of the license. All applications by an operator under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by 86 87 documentation that the applicant is in compliance with the 88 education requirements of Section 63-1-9(1)(g); the documentation 89 must be dated no more than thirty (30) days prior to the date of 90 application.

91 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 92 and after July 1, 2001.
