HOUSE BILL NO. 1204

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 9-1-107, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REVISE THE QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE DESIGNATION AS SENIOR JUDGE; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 9-1-107, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 9-1-107. (1) Retired Court of Appeals, chancery, circuit or 8 county court judges or retired Supreme Court Justices * * *, who 9 have served as a judge or justice for at least eight (8) years and who are either at least sixty-two (62) years of age or are 10 receiving state retirement benefits and who desire to be 11 12 designated as senior judges of the State of Mississippi shall file a certificate for such designation with the Supreme Court. 13 The certificate shall be in such form as prescribed by the Supreme 14 Court. The filing of such certificate shall place such judge on 15 16 senior status.

If judges who are placed on senior status are receiving 17 (2)18 retirement benefits by virtue of the provisions of the Public 19 Employees' Retirement Law of 1952, appearing as Sections 25-11-1 through 25-11-139, Mississippi Code of 1972, such benefits shall 20 21 not be reduced in any sum whatsoever because of being placed on senior status or because of service as a special judge, pursuant 22 23 to Section 9-1-105, nor shall any sum be deducted as contributions toward retirement under such law. 24

25 (3) The Supreme Court shall have the authority to promulgate 26 rules and regulations governing the service and tenure of senior 27 judges on senior status, and may remove from senior status any H. B. No. 1204 *HR07/R1469* G1/2 01/HR07/R1469 judge who does not comply with the dictates of this statute or who, without good cause, refuses appointment under Section 9-1-105.

31 (4) Any person appointed as senior judge on senior status 32 hereunder shall, for the period of his service as a special judge 33 pursuant to Section 9-1-105, receive compensation from the state 34 for each day's service a sum equal to 1/260 of the current salary in effect for the judicial offices. Any person appointed as a 35 senior judge on senior status shall be reimbursed for travel 36 expenses incurred in the performance of the official duties to 37 38 which he may be appointed hereunder in the same manner as other public officials and employees as provided by Section 25-3-41, 39 40 Mississippi Code of 1972. Each judge so serving shall make out an itemized account of the number of days he in good faith served, 41 and make affidavit to same and file it with the Clerk of the 42 Supreme Court. The said clerk shall issue a certificate showing 43 44 the length of time such senior judge or judges on senior status 45 served, and the Department of Finance and Administration shall issue its warrant therefor. 46

47 (5) During tenure as a senior judge, senior judges shall be 48 deemed active members of the Mississippi Conference of Judges and 49 shall be required to satisfy the requirements of continuing 50 judicial education.

51 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 52 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 53 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 54 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States 55 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 56 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 57 extended.

58 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 59 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 60 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
