HOUSE BILL NO. 1215

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-9-73, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 CREATE THE CRIME OF FLEEING OR ELUDING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 3 IN A MOTOR VEHICLE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 97-9-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 97-9-73. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to 8 obstruct or resist by force, or violence, or threats, or in any other manner, his lawful arrest or the lawful arrest of another 9 person by any state, local or federal law enforcement officer, and 10 any person or persons so doing shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, 11 12 and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in 13 the county jail not more than six (6) months, or both. 14

(2) It is unlawful for the operator of a motor vehicle, 15 16 having knowledge that he or she has been ordered to stop such 17 vehicle by a duly authorized law enforcement officer, willfully to 18 refuse or fail to stop the vehicle in compliance with such order 19 or, having stopped in knowing compliance with such order, willfully to flee in an attempt to elude the officer, and a person 20 who violates this subsection shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and 21 upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One 22 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for 23

24 <u>a term not to exceed six (6) months, or both.</u>

25 (3) Any person who willfully flees or attempts to elude a

26 law enforcement officer in an authorized law enforcement patrol

27 vehicle with agency insignia and other jurisdictional markings

28 prominently displayed on the vehicle with siren and lights

- 29 activated, and during the course of the fleeing or attempted
- 30 eluding drives at high speed, or in any manner which demonstrates
- 31 <u>a wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property, shall be</u>
- 32 guilty of a felony, and upon conviction shall be punished by a
- 33 fine not to exceed Five thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or by
- 34 commitment to the custody of the Department of Corrections for not
- 35 more than five (5) years, or both.
- 36 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 37 and after July 1, 2001.
