## HOUSE BILL NO. 1261

AN ACT TO CREATE A STUDY COMMITTEE ON CREATING A DIVISION OF FAMILY AND YOUTH SERVICES TO STUDY THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A STATE AGENCY TO ADMINISTER CERTAIN SPECIFIC FAMILY AND CHILDREN SERVICE PROGRAMS AND A COORDINATED SERVICES FUNDING SYSTEM FOR CHILDREN IN NEED OF SUCH SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. (1) There is created a study committee on creating a Division of Family and Youth Services which committee 8 9 shall study the establishment of an agency of state government which would be under the joint control of the Department of Human 10 11 services and the State Department of Education. The mission of 12 the division would be to focus on and administer programs relating to families and children, including: 13

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(a) The functions of the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Human Services;

16 (b) The functions of the Child Support Unit of the17 Department of Human Services;

18 (c) The functions of all child service programs 19 administered by the Department of Human Services, including the 20 foster care or foster home placement program, child adoption and 21 child placement, and investigation of child abuse and neglect;

(d) The administration of the school attendance
officers enforcing the Mississippi Compulsory School Attendance
Law administered by the State Department of Education;

(e) The alternative school programs administered by the
various school districts;

No. 1261 \*HR40/R1724\* 01/HR40/R1724 PAGE 1 (RM\BD) (g) The Support Our Students (SOS) community-based program under the State Department of Education and any other youth mentoring program operating under public grant funds;

32 (h) A Private Enterprise Mentorship Program for33 children in the custody of the Department of Human Services;

34 (i) Any program for children with severe emotional
35 disturbances which is not provided by the Mississippi Department
36 of Mental Health;

37 (j) Child care facility licensure programs administered38 by the Mississippi Department of Health; and

39 A Coordinated Services Plan for Children that uses (k) a decategorized funding system to budget and pay for all services 40 required for an individual child in need of the programs specified 41 in (a) through (i) and to ensure that the funds for approved 42 services follow the child. The study committee may study and make 43 recommendations on any other program relating to family or youth, 44 child welfare or children's services, including, but not limited 45 46 to, the youth court system in Mississippi, the child abuse and neglect laws of Mississippi, and the impact of state and federal 47 48 welfare reform initiatives on family and child welfare services in 49 Mississippi.

50 (2) The study committee shall make a report of its findings 51 and recommendations to the Legislature, the Lieutenant Governor 52 and the Governor before October 1, 2001, for implementation in the 53 2002 Regular Session. The report must include a strategic plan 54 for allocating funds and resources to programs relating to family 55 and youth services.

56 (3) The study committee shall be composed of the following 57 members:

58 (a) The Executive Director of the Department of Human59 Services;

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(b) The State Superintendent of Public Education;

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(C) 61 The Executive Director of the Mississippi 62 Department of Mental Health; The Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid 63 (d) 64 of the Office of the Governor; 65 (e) The executive director of one (1) regional mental 66 health/retardation center in the state, to be designated by the State Board of Mental Health; 67 (f) 68 The Attorney General; 69 The Director of the Council of Youth Court Judges; (g) The Chairman of the Senate Committee on Juvenile 70 (h) 71 Justice; The Chairman of the House Committee on Juvenile 72 (i) 73 Justice; 74 The Chairman of the Senate Committee on Education; (j) 75 The Chairman of the House Committee on Education; (k) 76 The Chairman of the Senate Committee on Public (1)77 Health and Welfare; and 78 The Chairman of the House Committee on Public (m) Health and Welfare. 79 80 If any member is unable to attend any meeting of the study 81 committee, the member may not designate another person to attend 82 or vote at such meeting. Within fifteen (15) days after passage of this act, on a day to be designated jointly by the Governor, 83 the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of 84 85 Representatives, the study committee shall meet and organize by selecting from its membership a chairman and a vice chairman. The 86 87 vice chairman shall serve as secretary and shall be responsible for keeping all records of the study committee. A majority of the 88 members of the study committee shall constitute a quorum. 89 All 90 members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, and such 91 notices must be mailed at least five (5) days before the date on 92 which a meeting is to be held.

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Any member of the study committee who is also a state 93 (4) 94 employee may not receive per diem compensation for attending meetings of the study committee, but may be reimbursed in 95 96 accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expense 97 incurred in the performance of their duties, if authorized by 98 vote, at a meeting of the study committee, which action shall be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting. Legislative 99 100 members of the study committee shall be paid from the contingent 101 expense funds of their respective houses in the same amounts as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in 102 103 session.

104 (5) The study committee may accept money from any source, 105 public or private, to be expended in implementing its duties under 106 this act.

107 (6) The study committee may utilize staff employed by the 108 agencies affected by this act and any other assistance made 109 available to it.

(7) Funding for the study committee may be provided from any funds that may be appropriated by the Legislature for that purpose.

113 (8) Upon presentation of its report, the study committee 114 shall be dissolved.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
