HOUSE BILL NO. 1283

- AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE MINIMUM 1 EDUCATION PROGRAM TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS HAVING THE HIGHEST 2 INCIDENCES OF CRIME AND VIOLENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING 3 SOCIAL WORKERS; TO DIRECT THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO 4 DETERMINE WHICH SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL RECEIVE SUCH ALLOTMENTS; TO 5 REQUIRE SOCIAL WORKERS EMPLOYED WITH THOSE FUNDS TO BE 6 APPROPRIATELY LICENSED; TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 7 EDUCATION TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE 8 ACTIVITIES OF THOSE SOCIAL WORKERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. (1) Beginning with the 2001-2002 school year,
- 12 the State Department of Education shall allot sufficient funding
- 13 under the minimum education program to those school districts
- 14 designated under subsection (2) of this section for the purpose of
- 15 employing a social worker.
- 16 (2) The State Department of Education shall designate school
- 17 districts to receive an allotment for the purpose of employing a
- 18 social worker. The districts shall be selected by the department
- 19 according to greatest need, as indicated by records of the State
- 20 Department of Education and the Division of Youth Services of the
- 21 Department of Human Services that reflect those school districts
- 22 having the highest incidences of crime, violence, food stamp
- 23 participation and unemployment.
- 24 (3) The State Department of Education may increase the
- 25 number of social worker positions funded each year beyond the
- 26 above requirements as money is made available.
- 27 (4) Any individual employed by a school district with funds
- 28 allotted under this section must be appropriately licensed as a
- 29 social worker under Section 73-53-1 et seq. The State Department

- 30 of Education shall specify which license a social worker must hold
- 31 as a qualification for being employed in a position funded under
- 32 this section.
- 33 (5) To qualify for minimum education program funding, school
- 34 social workers must be full-time professional personnel and must
- 35 spend at least seventy-five percent (75%) of their work time in a
- 36 direct relationship with students. School social workers may not
- 37 devote more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the work day to
- 38 administrative activities related to their social work.
- 39 (6) The State Department of Education may adopt rules and
- 40 regulations regarding the activities of the school social workers.
- 41 School social workers may perform those services that are not
- 42 inconsistent with such rules and regulations.
- 43 (7) Nothing in this section shall prohibit a school district
- 44 from employing social workers with local funds.
- 45 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 46 and after July 1, 2001.
