COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1313

AN ACT TO PRESCRIBE CERTAIN CONDUCT RELATING TO RAILROAD 1 LINES AND RAILROAD PROPERTY AS UNLAWFUL; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR 2 3 SUCH VIOLATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. (1) For purposes of this section, the term 5 "right-of-way" means track, roadbed and adjacent property which 6 would be readily recognizable to a reasonable person as railroad 7 8 property. It is unlawful for any person: 9 (2) (a) To board or disembark, or attempt to board or 10 disembark, a moving freight train; 11 (b) To damage or deface, or attempt to damage or 12 13 deface, railroad track, signals, switches, buildings, structures, bridges, rights-of-way, wire lines, motive power, rolling stock or 14 15 other property; or (c) To dump or cause to be dumped upon railroad 16 right-of-way any waste paper, ashes, sweepings, household wastes, 17 18 glass, metal, tires, mattresses, furniture, dangerous substances or any other refuse or rubbish of any kind. 19 (3) Subsection (2) of this section shall not apply to any of 20 21 the following: (a) Any person who first obtains written permission 22 from the owner or operator of the railroad line before engaging in 23 the conduct described in subsection (2) of this section; 24 Railroad passengers who are using those parts of 25 (b) 26 railroad property designated for passenger usage;

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27 (c) Railroad employees engaged in the performance of28 their duties;

29 (d) An authorized representative of the railroad30 employees; and

(e) Public officials, such as representatives of the
Mississippi Department of Transportation, the Surface
Transportation Board, the Federal Railroad Administration and the
National Transportation Safety Board, who are engaged in the
performance of official duties.

36 (4) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any
 37 railroad right-of-way which has been legally abandoned and which
 38 is not being used for railroad purposes.

39 SECTION 2. Any person who violates Section 1 of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be 40 punished by imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, or by 41 a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Two 42 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or by both such fine and 43 imprisonment. In addition, any person who is convicted for a 44 violation of subsection (2)(b) or subsection (2)(c) of Section 1 45 46 of this act shall be ordered by the court to make restitution to the owners or operators of the railroad line or property in an 47 48 amount determined by the court to compensate for all damages caused by such person and all costs related to cleanup 49 necessitated as a result of such person's unlawful conduct. 50 51 SECTION 3. The penalties and relief provided for in this act

52 shall be in addition to all other fines, penalties and punishment 53 as otherwise may be prescribed by law for such unlawful conduct. 54 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 55 and after July 1, 2001.
