HOUSE BILL NO. 1409

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 63-5-19, 63-5-21 AND 63-7-47,
- 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY CERTAIN PROVISIONS WHICH

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 SECTION 1. Section 63-5-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 13 63-5-19. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
- 14 no single vehicle, unladen or with load, shall have an overall
- 15 length, inclusive of front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty
- 16 (40) feet.
- 17 (2) No semitrailer operating in a truck tractor-semitrailer
- 18 combination and no trailer drawn by a motor vehicle shall exceed a
- 19 length of fifty (50) feet.
- 20 (3) No semitrailer or trailer operating in a truck
- 21 tractor-semitrailer-trailer combination and no trailer operating
- 22 in a double trailer combination drawn by a motor vehicle shall
- 23 exceed a length of thirty (30) feet.
- 24 (4) No semitrailer or trailer combinations in excess of two
- 25 (2) units, excluding the towing motor vehicle, shall be allowed to
- 26 operate on the highways of this state.
- 27 (5) No motor home shall have an overall length exclusive of
- 28 front and rear bumpers, in excess of forty-five (45) feet.
