## HOUSE BILL NO. 1479

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 43-11-13 AND 73-17-9, MISSISSIPPI 1 CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE NURSING HOME SURVEYORS TO OBSERVE ACTUAL 2. NURSING HOME OPERATIONS AS PART OF BASIC TRAINING; AND FOR RELATED 3 4 PURPOSES BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 43-11-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows: 43-11-13. (1) The licensing agency shall adopt, amend, 8 promulgate and enforce such rules, regulations and standards, 9 10 including classifications, with respect to all institutions for the aged or infirm to be licensed hereunder as may be designed to 11 further the accomplishment of the purpose of this chapter in 12 promoting adequate care of individuals in such institutions in the 13 14 interest of public health, safety and welfare. Such rules, 15 regulations and standards shall be adopted and promulgated by the licensing agency and shall be recorded and indexed in a book to be 16 17 maintained by the licensing agency in its main office in the State of Mississippi, entitled "Rules, Regulations and Minimum Standards 18 for Institutions for the Aged or Infirm" and said book shall be 19 20 open and available to all institutions for the aged or infirm and 21 the public generally at all reasonable times. Upon the adoption 22 of such rules, regulations and standards, the licensing agency shall mail copies thereof to all such institutions in the state 23 24 which have filed with said agency their names and addresses for 25 this purpose, but the failure to mail the same or the failure of the institutions to receive the same shall in nowise affect the 26

validity thereof. Said rules, regulations and standards may be

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- 28 amended by the licensing agency from time to time as necessary to
- 29 promote the health, safety and welfare of persons living in said
- 30 institutions.
- 31 (2) The licensee shall keep posted in a conspicuous place on
- 32 the licensed premises all current rules, regulations and minimum
- 33 standards applicable to fire protection measures as adopted by the
- 34 licensing agency. The licensee shall furnish to the licensing
- 35 agency at least once each six (6) months a certificate of approval
- 36 and inspection by state or local fire authorities. Failure to
- 37 comply with state laws and/or municipal ordinances and current
- 38 rules, regulations and minimum standards as adopted by the
- 39 licensing agency, relative to fire prevention measures, shall be
- 40 prima facie evidence for revocation of license.
- 41 (3) The State Board of Health shall promulgate rules and
- 42 regulations restricting the storage, quantity and classes of drugs
- 43 allowed in personal care homes. Residents requiring
- 44 administration of Schedule II Narcotics as defined in the Uniform
- 45 Controlled Substances Law may be admitted to a personal care home.
- 46 Schedule drugs may only be allowed in a personal care home if they
- 47 are administered or stored utilizing proper procedures under the
- 48 direct supervision of a licensed physician or nurse.
- 49 (4) Beginning July 1, 2001, the licensing agency shall
- 50 provide that each newly hired nursing home surveyor, as part of
- 51 his basic training, is assigned full time to a licensed
- 52 institution for the aged or infirm, for at least ten (10) days
- 53 within a fourteen-day period to observe actual operation outside
- of the survey process before the trainee begins oversight
- 55 responsibilities. Subsequently, the surveyor shall not be a part
- of a survey or survey team in a facility in which he has observed,
- 57 for a period of at least three (3) years.
- 58 SECTION 2. Section 73-17-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 59 amended as follows:
- 73-17-9. It shall be the function and duty of the board to:

- 61 (a) (i) Develop, impose, and enforce standards which
- 62 must be met by individuals in order to receive a license as a
- 63 nursing home administrator, which standards shall be designed to
- 64 insure that nursing home administrators will be individuals who
- 65 are of good character and are otherwise suitable, and who, by
- 66 training or experience in the field of institutional
- 67 administration, are qualified to serve as nursing home
- 68 administrators;
- (ii) Beginning July 1, 2001, the board shall
- 70 provide that meeting the standard will include a requirement that
- 71 the individual spend at least ten (10) days within a fourteen-day
- 72 period with surveyors and personnel of the Division of Licensure
- 73 and Certification, State Department of Health, to observe actual
- 74 operations of the licensure and survey process.
- 75 (b) Develop and apply appropriate techniques, including
- 76 examinations and investigations, for determining whether an
- 77 individual meets such standards;
- 78 (c) Issue licenses to individuals determined, after the
- 79 application of such techniques, to meet such standards, and revoke
- 80 or suspend licenses previously issued by the board in any case
- 81 where the individual holding any such license is determined
- 82 substantially to have failed to conform to the requirements of
- 83 such standards;
- 84 (d) Establish and carry out procedures designed to
- 85 insure that individuals licensed as nursing home administrators
- 86 will, during any period that they serve as such, comply with the
- 87 requirements of such standards;
- 88 (e) Receive, investigate, and take appropriate action
- 89 with respect to any charge or complaint filed with the board to
- 90 the effect that any individual licensed as a nursing home
- 91 administrator has failed to comply with the requirements of such
- 92 standards;

93	(f) Conduct a continuing study and investigation of
94	nursing homes and administrators of nursing homes within the state
95	with a view to the improvement of the standards imposed for the
96	licensing of such administrators and of procedures and methods for
97	the enforcement of such standards with respect to administrators
98	of nursing homes who have been licensed as such; and
99	(g) To devise and implement an educational program
100	designed to increase the professional proficiency of nursing home
101	administrators and to assist otherwise qualified individuals to
102	prepare for careers in nursing home administration.
103	SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
104	and after July 1, 2001.
