The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and 8 maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002..... 9 \$ 2,194,341.00. 10 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of 13 Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and 14 ending June 30, 2002..... \$ 5,810,887.00. 15 Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million 16 17 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state 18 excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products. 19 SECTION 3. 43 Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be 44 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Four Hundred 45 Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) per annum.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 46 47 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal 48 49 Services" for Fiscal Year 2003 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2002 50 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 51 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2003 budget by the 52 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 53 54 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 55 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 56 act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 57 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2002 appropriation for "Personal 58 59 Services" when annualized. 61 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 62 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2002 "Personal Services" 63 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 64 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 65 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 66 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

67 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 68 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Marine Resources shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source that may become available to the department in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

In addition to all other sums heretofore 80 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 81 82 Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3450, to the Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the 83 expenses of the Tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning 84 July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002..... \$ 5,000,000.00. 85 86 With the funds appropriated in this section, the following

119 It is the intention of the Legislature that any political 120 subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the 121 subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department 122 of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2001. All proposals 123 submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of 124 Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. 125 Multi-phased projects, multi-year projects, proposed projects with

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128 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of 129 the tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual 130 amount of tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be 131 made allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 132 section.

133 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 134 Department of Marine Resources be allowed to make necessary 135 transfers from the Subsidies, Loans and Grants category of 136 expenditures to any other categories of expenditures for the 137 purpose of expending Tidelands funds as appropriated in House Bill 138 No. 1636 of the Regular Session of 2000.

The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 139 SECTION 7. the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 140 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 141 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 142 143 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 144 145 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001, except for Section 6 which shall take 146 147 effect from and after passage and through June 30, 2001.
