COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 1596

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE 1 STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION; AND FOR RELATED 3 PURPOSES, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2002. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 6 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 7 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 8 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Transportation Funds, for the purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the 9 10 Mississippi Department of Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002..... 11 12\$ 849,405,342.00. 13 SECTION 2. The following offices are supported by the funds appropriated in Section 1: The Office of Administrative Services, 14 15 the Office of Highways, the Office of Aeronautics and Rails and the Office of Enforcement. 36 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 37 38 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2003 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2002 39 40 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 41 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2003 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 42 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 43 44 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 45 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 46 act. 47 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2002 appropriation for "Personal 48 49 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 50 51 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 52 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2002 "Personal Services" appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 53 54 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 55 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 56 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 57 58 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. 59 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be

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being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of thisact and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

Of the funds appropriated herein, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall construct an exit and crossover on that portion of Mississippi Highway 25 in Winston County between the Mississippi Highway 15/25 Bypass around the City of Louisville and that portion of Business Route Highway 15 in order to provide access to the existing businesses.

69 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 70 Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1 and 71 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, the following amounts 72 shall be available for expenditure in the program budgets as 73 required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi Code of 1972:

Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 81 82 authorized for expenditure in Section 2, it is the intention of the Legislature that One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) 83 shall be transferred to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce 84 85 for the Beaver Control or Eradication Program during the Fiscal

86 Year 2002.

SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend such funds as necessary to acquire and implement a highway segment budget and project management system which shall capture and implement the following for all preliminary engineering, right-of-way and construction contracts:

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(a) Establishment of a master budget for each segment
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of highway to be constructed, reconstructed or repaired. For 94 95 purposes of this management system, no segment shall be less than 96 ten (10) miles in length unless a shorter segment is specifically 97 authorized or required in law, the segment connects two (2) 98 four-lane highways which were in existence on July 1, 2001, or 99 when it is at least ten percent (10%) less expensive to construct, 100 reconstruct or repair two (2) or more segments of less than ten 101 (10) miles in length.

102 (b) Oversight and management of the master budget for103 segments which will:

104 (i) Establish a reasonable cost estimate to serve
105 as a budget for each project within a segment. For purposes of
106 this provision, projects include preliminary engineering,
107 right-of-way acquisition and construction.

108 (ii) Capture and retain the initial project109 budgets for comparison with final actual expenditures.

(iii) Capture and retain the initial segmentbudget for comparison with final segment actual expenditures.

(iv) Require that any changes to a budget for a project will be reviewed and approved by district or central office personnel. Such personnel shall be responsible for signing any revision, providing a narrative description of the reasons for approving a revision and why other alternative(s) were inappropriate.

(v) With existing resources, develop an information system to provide the Legislature, managers and the public with up-to-date segment cost and status information.

(vi) Capture the costs of consultants, engineers, 121 attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and 122 professional contractors used in preliminary engineering, 123 124 right-of-way acquisition and construction projects. 125 (vii) Ensure that projects for preliminary 126 engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction do not *HR05/A941CS* H. 127 overlap segments.

128 (viii) Track and report the final segment cost and129 a comparison to the bid cost.

130 (ix) Track and compare actual completion dates131 with the bid completion date.

(x) Track and report all construction contract
change orders and the impact they have had on the bid price for a
segment.

SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend such funds as necessary to compile and deliver to the Legislature by December 10, 2001, the following reports on the highway segments authorized under Sections 65-3-97 and 65-39-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, and any nonprogram segments:

(a) All preapproved contractors who subsequently receive contracts from the department. Such reports shall include the name of the contractor, the amount paid, the title of the project on which the contractor worked and the description of services provided.

(b) A compilation of all segments of less than ten (10)
miles in length which were authorized by the Mississippi
Transportation Commission. This listing shall include:

149 (i) Contract let date;

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(iii) A description of the segment, including the beginning and end point of the contract;

(ii) The highway on which the contract was let;

153 (iv) The length of the segment in miles; and 154 (v) Name of the contractor selected to perform 155 contract work;

(c) A compilation of costs for all preliminary engineering, right-of-way and construction contracts entered during the reporting period;

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(d) A listing of all segments completed or in progress
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160 by topographical area of the state for the reporting period;

(e) A status report of road segments to include road segment description, the date of construction of the road, and the pavement condition rating, which includes roadbed rutting and condition factors; and

(f) A report on the causes of roadbed deterioration for all highways in the state highway system and any proposed remedies for these problems.

SECTION 7. None of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of 168 this act may be used by the Department of Transportation to 169 170 complete construction on the 1987 four-lane highway program established under Section 65-3-97, Mississippi Code of 1972, 171 172 construct roads in the gaming roads program created under Section 65-39-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, construct nonprogram projects, 173 174 or contract for reconstruction or repair in segments of less than ten (10) miles in length except as authorized by general law, or 175 176 whenever the Mississippi Transportation Commission determines by 177 entry upon its minutes that it is at least ten percent (10%) less expensive to construct, reconstruct or repair two(2) or more 178 179 segments of less than ten (10) miles in length. In addition, none of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act may be expended 180 181 by the Department of Transportation for new segment construction 182 except through contracts which incorporate paving, grade, drain 183 and bridge work into a single contract for each segment.

184 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi 185 Department of Transportation, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars 186 (\$300,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention 187 Program.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority to escalate and expend funds from any proceeds arising from participation in drug seizure activities not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00).

It is the intention of the Legislature that the 194 Mississippi Department of Transportation shall have the authority 195 to escalate its budget and expend funds obtained from the "buy 196 back" option offered by equipment manufacturers and/or suppliers 197 of certain types of equipment not to exceed One Million Dollars 198 (\$1,000,000.00) in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 199 200 consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall retain and maintain as a state highway that portion of Mississippi Highway 63 in George County and the City of Lucedale, beginning at or near Sally Parker Road and extending northerly to U. S. Highway 98, that has been replaced by the Transportation Department with a municipal bypass.

208 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, none 209 shall be expended until the provisions of House Bill No. 1324, 210 Regular Session of 2000, have been met.

SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall widen the existing two (2) lanes to four (4) lanes for that portion of Mississippi Highway 3 in Quitman County beginning at or near the City of Lambert and extending northerly and ending at Mississippi Highway 6.

217 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 218 of Section 1, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall 219 retain and maintain as a state highway any segment of Mississippi 220 Highway 15 in Chickasaw County that has been replaced by the 221 Transportation Department with a municipal bypass.

SECTION 15. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal H. 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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 16. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2001.
