BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 8 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department of Education, and 10 11 excluding the expenses of the Vocational and Technical Education 12 Division, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending 13 June 30, 2002.....\$ 139,436,139.00. 14 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Education which is comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002.....

The published budget shall include the following statement: "Ad Valorem taxes will be \$_____ less as a result 103 104 of the Ad Valorem Reduction Grants enacted by the Mississippi Legislature in 1992." 105

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Sections 9 and 10, an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Twenty-nine Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-four Dollars (\$229,684.00) is authorized for the support of Vocational and Technical Education Programs as authorized in Section 37-31-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, for a period in excess of ten (10) months in a calendar year.

233 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 9 and 10, 234 no more than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is 235 provided for the purpose of supporting the Future Farmers of 236 America Center.

237 SECTION 16. With respect to agency programs whose operation

277 is dependent on the receipt of federal funds, it is the intent of 278 the Legislature, except as hereinafter provided, that no funds 279 from the State General Fund be expended to administer, support or in any way continue such programs should federal funds for their 280 281 operation be reduced or become unavailable and that no funds from 282 the State General Fund available for expenditure under this act 283 shall be used to replace federal funds in any major object of 284 expenditure.

SECTION 20. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Education and Vocational and Technical Education Division shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the H. Should revenues generated and deposited to the Education Enhancement Fund pursuant to Section 27-103-203 (1), 303 Mississippi Code of 1972, and apportioned pursuant to Section 304 305 37-61-33 (6), Mississippi Code of 1972, fall below funds 306 appropriated herein from said source, the State Department of 307 Education shall notify the Department of Finance and Administration as to which allotments shall be reduced to insure 308 309 expenditures do not exceed actual revenues.

SECTION 22. Of the funds provided in Section 1 for the 310 311 purpose of providing financial assistance for the education of exceptional children as determined under Section 37-23-63, 312 Mississippi Code of 1972, children who are certified by the 313 314 designated authority as requiring inpatient care in a private intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded or 315 316 psychiatric residential treatment facility, with Medicaid 317 reimbursement, shall be eligible and entitled to receive state financial assistance under the provisions of Section 37-23-69, in 318 an amount not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from 319 320 state funds, per child per school year, if an approved private 321 school is operated as an integral part of the facility which 322 provides twenty-four (24) hours a day monitoring, treatment and *HR40/A202PH* H. 323 education, except that the State Department of Education is 324 authorized to pilot a fee-for-service based cost system for 325 children served through Millcreek Schools, Inc.

326 SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 327 of Sections 1 and 2, the amount of One Hundred Sixteen Million 328 Seventeen Thousand Three Hundred Twenty-one Dollars 329 (\$116,017,321.00) shall be derived from the Interim School 330 District Capital Expenditure Fund for the benefit of the school 331 districts as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2649, 1997 Regular 332 Session.

333 SECTION 24. Of the funds provided in Section 1, Five Hundred Seventy-nine Thousand Four Hundred Sixty-four Dollars 334 335 (\$579,464.00) shall be used to provide for a Director of School 336 Nurses in the State Department of Education and the implementation 337 of three (3) pilot projects for a variety of school health programs in an elementary school setting. Evaluations shall be 338 339 developed to determine the program's effect to drop-out rates, 340 suspensions, expulsions, attendance and test scores.

Income generated by the school-based clinics shall remain available for expenditure by the programs utilizing any special fund authority provided in Section 2 for use by the State Department of Education and the pilots shall remain the same as in Fiscal Year 2001.

346 SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 347 State Department of Education shall have the authority to accept, 348 budget and expend any source funds not to exceed Thirty Million 349 Dollars (\$30,000,000.00), that become available to the department 350 to carry out the provisions of those funds in a manner consistent 351 with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 352 Administration.

353 SECTION 26. The State Department of Education shall transfer 354 the designated amounts to the appropriate entities, which shall 355 assume full responsibility for the expenditure of these funds in H. B. No. 1609 *HR40/A202PH* 01/HR40/A202PH

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accordance with state laws and accept all responsibility for any 356 357 improper expenditure. For the following: National Guard Youth 358 Challenge Program, World Class Teacher Programs, USM Special 359 Education Program, Soil and Water Conservation Commission, 360 Mississippi School Boards Association, Mississippi Eye Screening 361 Program and Very Special Arts, Arts Institute, Jackson State 362 University Media Center, Jobs for Mississippi Graduates, and 363 Mississippi Symphony.

364 SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is 365 the intention of the Legislature that Eighteen Million Dollars 366 (\$18,000,000.00) from the Public School Building Fund shall be 367 used for the Mississippi Adequate Education Program.

368 <u>SECTION 28.</u> It is the intention of the Legislature that the 369 Department of Education shall conduct a study comparing the 370 average administrative cost for Mississippi school districts, and 371 also the ratio of administrative staff to the number of students, 372 to the contiguous southeastern states. This study shall be 373 concluded and presented to the Governor and the Legislature by 374 November 15, 2001.

375 SECTION 29. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 376 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 377 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 378 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 379 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 380 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. SECTION 30. This act shall take effect and be in force from 381 382 and after July 1, 2001.
