5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be	
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State	
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and	
8	maintenance of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year	
9	beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002

11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be	
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special	
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry	
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by	
15	or otherwise available to the commission, for the support and	
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning	
17	July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002

19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty	
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund	
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement

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No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the Capital Outlay: Equipment major object of expenditure, with funds generated from the Forest Acreage Tax, and with funds generated from the sale of old equipment and lease of tower sites an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00). It is further the intention of the Legislature that the State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate its budget in the Subsidies, Loans and Grants major object of expenditure, with funds generated from the Severance Tax to fund the Forest Resource

Development Program in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred

- 128 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 129 State Forestry Commission be allowed to escalate part-time
- 130 positions up to one hundred (100) and expend funds not to exceed
- 131 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any source of
- 132 funds that become available to the commission. This escalation
- 133 shall be in accordance with rules and regulations of the
- 134 Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent
- 135 with the escalation of federal funds. These positions may be used
- 136 to protect life and property during extended periods of extreme
- 137 wildfire occurrences of a minimum of fifty (50) fires per day.
- 138 The escalation of positions and the expenditure of these funds
- 139 shall be at the discretion of the State Forester, with written
- 140 notification to the State Personnel Board and the State Fiscal
- 141 Officer.
- 142 SECTION 7. The Forestry Commission has the authority to
- 143 purchase from the "General Services Administration" Fire Fighter

- 145 SECTION 8. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 146 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 147 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 148 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 149 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 150 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 151 SECTION 9. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 152 and after July 1, 2001.
