1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2002.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002
10	\$ 13,244,767.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special
13	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of
14	Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source
15	funds collected by or otherwise available to the department for
16	the support and maintenance of the department, for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002
18	\$ 36,146,690.00.
19	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
20	above in this section, is hereby appropriated out of the state
21	excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to
22	the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
23	July 1, 2001, and ending June 30, 2002 \$5,750,000.00.
24	The State Tax Commission is hereby directed to set aside the
25	amount of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it
26	sees fit, out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and
27	other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside
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from such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
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    provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
    as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
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    any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of

         Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be

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         SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of

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    Fisheries, funds in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand

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    from the Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections

152	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of	
153	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to	
154	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal	
155	Services" for Fiscal Year 2003 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2002	
156	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions	
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are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2003 budget by the 157 158 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 159 160 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 161 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 162 act. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 163 that no single personnel action increases this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2002 appropriation for "Personal 164 165 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 166 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 167 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2002 "Personal Services" 168 169 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 170 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 171 such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 172 173 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive 174 Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may transfer between the various divisions authorized herein both 175 176 funds and positions not to exceed five percent (5%) of the 177 authorized budgets in the aggregate. The Executive Director of 178 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget 179 Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or 180 181 before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the transfer. 182 183 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 184 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law. No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 185 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 186 187 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 188 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 6. The board of supervisors of any county or any 189 190 group or combination of counties are hereby authorized and 191 empowered to enter into cooperative agreements with each other and 192 with the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the 193 purpose of creating, improving or restoring public game and fish 194 habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such 195 county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend a sum not exceeding One 196 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general county 197 198 fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the 199 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost of all 200 surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of 201 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of 202 supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their 203 discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the 204 purposes of this act with any other county, the United States 205 Forest Service or any other agency if same should be necessary for 206 the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for such purposes. 207 The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to 208 lease all woodlands now existing on the O'Keefe Division of the 209 Department of Corrections for use of a game preserve and refuge, 210 upon such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon by 211 the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and the Department 212 of Corrections. 213 SECTION 7. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is hereby directed to keep an exact accounting of the funds 214 215 received during each fiscal year by fund and source and an exact 216 accounting of how these funds were expended by fund and program/division. Such information shall be provided to the House 217 and Senate Appropriations Chairmen, Chairman of the House Game and 218 Fish Committee and Chairmen of the Senate Wildlife and Fisheries 219 220 and Senate Ports and Marine Resources Committee no later than 221 October 1 following the end of the fiscal year. *HR05/A473* H. B. No. 1624

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SECTION 8. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks 222 223 is authorized to enter into an agreement with the Pearl River 224 Valley Water Supply District to provide for financial support of 225 an additional conservation officer on and around the Ross Barnett 226 Reservoir. The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to 227 escalate the budget of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and 228 229 Parks for this purpose. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or 230 SECTION 9. 231 other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of 232 any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for 233 234 any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of 235 Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof. 236 It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply 237 with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972. 238 239 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the 240 241 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from any source, not 242 to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00), that may 243 become available to the department in accordance with the rules 244 and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration. 245 None of the funds authorized in this section shall be used to 246 increase the major object of expenditure "Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits." 247 248 SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 249 250 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 251 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 252 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, 253 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted 254 performance measures provided below:

- 323 SECTION 16. The Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks
- 324 is authorized to establish new DWFP Special Operations Agent I,
- 325 II, and III job titles and such job titles shall be classified as
- 326 nonstate service.
- 327 SECTION 17. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
- 328 Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of

- 339 Mason Creek Wildlife Management Area.
- 340 SECTION 19. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 341 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 342 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 343 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 344 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 345 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 346 SECTION 20. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 347 and after July 1, 2001.
