## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 36	5,
--	----

- 2 MISSISSIPPI CONSTITUTION OF 1890, TO LIMIT THE LENGTH OF ALL
- 3 LEGISLATIVE SESSIONS TO 90 DAYS BEGINNING WITH THE LEGISLATIVE
- 4 SESSION TO BE HELD IN 2004; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF
- 6 MISSISSIPPI, That the following amendment to the Mississippi
- 7 Constitution of 1890 is proposed to the qualified electors of the
- 8 state:
- 9 Amend Section 36, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, to read
- 10 as follows:
- [Until January 1, 2004, this section shall read as follows:]
- "Section 36. The Legislature shall meet at the seat of
- 13 government in regular session on the Tuesday after the first
- 14 Monday of January of the year A.D., 1970, and annually thereafter,
- 15 unless sooner convened by the Governor; provided, however, that
- 16 such sessions shall be limited to a period of one hundred
- 17 twenty-five (125) calendar days for regular 1972 session and every
- 18 fourth year thereafter, but ninety (90) calendar days for every
- 19 other regular session thereafter. Provided further that the House
- 20 of Representatives, by resolution with the Senate concurring
- 21 therein, and by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those present and
- voting in each house, may extend such limited session for a period
- 23 of thirty (30) days with no limit on the number of extensions to
- 24 each session."
- 25 [From and after January 1, 2004, this section shall read as
- 26 follows:]
- "Section 36. The Legislature shall meet at the seat of
- 28 government in regular session on the Tuesday after the first

- 29 Monday of January of the year A.D., 2004, and annually thereafter,
- 30 unless sooner convened by the Governor \* \* \*. Such sessions shall
- 31 be limited to a period of \* \* \* ninety (90) calendar days \* \* \*.
- 32 However, the House of Representatives, by resolution with the
- 33 Senate concurring therein, and by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those
- 34 present and voting in each house, may extend such limited session
- 35 for a period of thirty (30) days with no limit on the number of
- 36 extensions to each session."
- 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment shall be
- 38 submitted by the Secretary of State to the qualified electors at
- 39 an election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday
- 40 of November 2002, as provided by Section 273 of the Constitution
- 41 and by general law.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the explanation of this proposed
- 43 amendment for the ballot shall read as follows: "This proposed
- 44 constitutional amendment limits the length of all legislative
- 45 sessions to 90 days beginning with the legislative session to be
- 46 held in 2004."
