## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 104

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING ARTHUR STANLEY DEARMAN
UPON HIS SUCCESSFUL CAREER AS EDITOR AND PUBLISHER OF THE NESHOBA
DEMOCRAT.

WHEREAS, Arthur Stanley Dearman was named editor of The 4 5 Neshoba Democrat on November 15, 1966, and has served longer than any other editor since the paper's founding in August 1881; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Mr. Dearman was born July 24, 1932, in the Whynot 8 community of Lauderdale County, Mississippi, the son of the late 9 Jesse Arthur Dearman and Gertrude Edwards Dearman; and WHEREAS, after graduating from Meridian High School in 1950, 10 Mr. Dearman attended Meridian Junior College for one year before 11 12 entering the United States Navy; and WHEREAS, during the Korean Conflict, Mr. Dearman was 13 stationed for three years in Hawaii and for one year in 14 California; and 15 16 WHEREAS, following his military service to his country, Mr. Dearman completed his second year at Meridian Junior College; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in 1957, Mr. Dearman entered the University of 19 Mississippi, where he graduated with degrees in English and 20 journalism; and WHEREAS, while in school at Ole Miss, Mr. Dearman was elected 21 editor of the student newspaper, The Mississippian, today known as 22

23 The Daily Mississippian; and

24 WHEREAS, after graduating from college, Mr. Dearman worked on 25 The Meridian Star as a reporter and photographer in general 26 assignments and later as state editor; and 27 WHEREAS, Mr. Dearman served as managing editor of The Neshoba 28 Democrat from November 1966 until February 1968, when he purchased 29 the paper from August G. Eckert and Phyllis Eckert Weber of 30 Louisiana; and

31 WHEREAS, after 44 years of editing and publishing, Mr.
32 Dearman sold The Neshoba Democrat on August 1, 2000; and

33 WHEREAS, it is the policy of this Legislature to recognize 34 and commend outstanding Mississippians such as Mr. Dearman, whose 35 long and distinguished career in journalism has kept the people of 36 Neshoba County fully informed:

37 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 38 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, THE SENATE CONCURRING 39 THEREIN, That we do hereby commend Mr. Arthur Stanley Dearman on 40 his successful career as editor and publisher of The Neshoba 41 Democrat and extend our heartiest wishes for success in all his 42 future endeavors.
