HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 36

1 A RESOLUTION URGING THE STATE TAX COMMISSION TO RESTORE THE
 2 USE OF COUNTY IDENTIFYING DATA IN TAG NUMBERS.

3 WHEREAS, Mississippi law previously required that the number
 4 of the tag shall be written across the face of it and the number
 5 of the tag shall represent the registration number; and

6 WHEREAS, license tags for private passenger vehicles were
 7 required to have printed the name of the county in which such
 8 vehicle is registered and the date of expiration below the number
 9 of the tag; and

10 WHEREAS, in the past, the State Tax Commission used the
 11 system of county alphabetical and numerical identification for
 12 individual tags; and

13 WHEREAS, the implementation of this system can help law
 14 enforcement, county and state agencies to better identify
 15 vehicles; and

16 WHEREAS, this form of county alphabetical and numerical
 17 identification should not apply to special license tags or plates,
 18 commonly known as vanity or personalized tags:

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF
 20 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby
 21 urge the State Tax Commission to restore the use of county
 22 identifying data in tag numbers.

23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be
 24 furnished to the State Tax Commission and to the members of the
 25 Capitol Press Corps.
