6	SECTION 1. Section 37-159-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	37-159-11. (1) There is established the Mississippi
9	Employer-Assisted Housing Teacher Program, which shall be a
10	special home loan program for eligible licensed teachers who
11	render service to the state in a geographical area of the state
12	where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated
13	by the State Board of Education. The home loan program shall be
14	administered by the State Department of Education in conjunction
15	with the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae). The
16	department may contract with one or more public or private
17	entities to provide assistance in implementing and administering
18	the program. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and
19	regulations regarding the implementation and administration of the

- (2) Participation in the loan program shall be available to 21 22 any licensed teacher who renders service in a geographical area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as 23 designated by the State Board of Education. Any person who 24 25 receives a loan under the program shall be required to purchase a house and reside in a county in which the school district for
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- 27 which the teacher is rendering service, or any portion of the

program.

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- 28 school district, is located. The maximum amount of a loan that
- 29 may be made under the program to any person shall be Six Thousand
- 30 Dollars (\$6,000.00).
- 31 (3) Any loan made under the program to a person who actually
- 32 renders service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state
- 33 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated
- 34 by the State Board of Education, shall be converted to an
- 35 interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for
- 36 one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan. Any person who does
- 37 not render three (3) years' service as a teacher in a geographical
