## SENATE BILL NO. 2209

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 41-59-35, 41-59-45, 41-60-11 AND 1 41-60-13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF CERTAIN 2 EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE TECHNICIAN TITLES UNLESS THE USER HAS 3 BEEN CERTIFIED BY LAW, TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO 4 LEVY FINES AGAINST AMBULANCE SERVICES, EMERGENCY MEDICAL 5 TECHNICIANS AND DRIVERS FOR STATUTORY AND REGULATORY VIOLATIONS, б 7 TO CLARIFY THE NATIONAL STANDARD CURRICULUM PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS OF TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT 8 TRAINEES AND PERSONNEL; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. Section 41-59-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows:

13 41-59-35. (1) An emergency medical technician certificate 14 so issued shall be valid for a period not exceeding two (2) years 15 from the date of issuance and may be renewed upon payment of a 16 renewal fee to be fixed by the board, which shall be paid to the 17 board, provided that the holder meets the qualifications set forth 18 in this Chapter <u>59 and Chapter 60</u> and <u>rules and</u> regulations 19 promulgated by the board.

(2) The board is authorized to suspend or revoke a
certificate so issued at any time it is determined that the holder
no longer meets the prescribed qualifications.

<u>(3) It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or</u>
 <u>association to, in any manner, represent himself or itself as an</u>
 Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical

27 or Emergency Medical Services Driver, or use in connection with

28 his or its name the words or letters of EMT, emt, paramedic, or

29 any other letters, words, abbreviations or insignia which would

30	indicate or imply that he or it is an Emergency Medical
31	Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical Technician-Intermediate,
32	Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, or Emergency Medical
33	Services Driver. It shall be unlawful to employ an uncertified
34	Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical
35	Technician-Intermediate, or Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic
36	to provide basic or advanced life support services.
37	(4) Any Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency
38	Medical Technician-Intermediate, Emergency Medical
39	Technician-Paramedic, or Emergency Medical Services Driver who
40	violates or fails to comply with these statutes or the rules and
41	regulations promulgated by the board hereunder shall be subject,
42	after due notice and hearing, to an administrative fine not to
43	exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
44	SECTION 2. Section 41-59-45, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
45	amended as follows:
46	41-59-45. (1) It shall be the duty of the licensed owner of
47	any ambulance service or other employer of emergency medical
48	technicians for the purpose of providing basic or advanced life
49	support services to insure compliance with the provisions of this
50	Chapter 59 and Chapter 60 and all rules and regulations
51	promulgated by the board.
52	(2) Any person, corporation or association that violates any
53	rule or regulation promulgated by the board pursuant to these
54	statutes regarding the provision of ambulance services or the
55	provision of basic or advanced life support services by emergency
56	medical technicians shall, after due notice and hearing, be
57	subject to an administrative fine not to exceed One Thousand
58	Dollars (\$1,000.00) per occurrence.
59	(3) Any person violating or failing to comply with any other
60	provisions of this Chapter $59$ or Chapter $60$ shall be deemed guilty

 $\,$  61  $\,$  of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined an

amount not to exceed Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or be imprisoned for a 62 63 period not to exceed thirty (30) days, or both, for each offense. 64 (4) The board may cause to be instituted a civil action in 65 the chancery court of the county in which any alleged offender of 66 this Chapter 59 or Chapter 60 may reside or have his principal 67 place of business for injunctive relief to prevent any violation of any provision of this Chapter 59 or Chapter 60, or any rules or 68 regulation adopted by the board pursuant to the provisions of this 69 70 Chapter 59 or Chapter 60.

(5) Each day that any violation or failure to comply with any provision of this chapter <u>or any rule or regulation</u> <u>promulgated by the board thereto</u> is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate and distinct offense under this section, except that the court may, in its discretion, stay the cumulation of penalties.

77 It shall not be considered a violation of this Chapter <u>59 or</u> 78 <u>Chapter 60</u> for a vehicle domiciled in a nonparticipating 79 jurisdiction to travel in a participating jurisdiction.

80 SECTION 3. Section 41-60-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 81 amended as follows:

41-60-11. As used in Sections 41-60-11 and 41-60-13, unless
the context otherwise requires, the term:

(a) "Advanced life support" shall mean a sophisticated 84 85 level of prehospital and interhospital emergency care which 86 includes basic life support functions including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), plus cardiac monitoring, cardiac 87 88 defibrillation, telemetered electrocardiography, administration of 89 antiarnythmic agents, intravenous therapy, administration of specific medications, drugs and solutions, use of adjunctive 90 ventilation devices, trauma care and other authorized techniques 91 92 and procedures. 93 (b) "Advanced life support personnel" shall mean 94 persons other than physicians engaged in the provision of advanced

97 (c) "Emergency medical technician-intermediate" shall
98 mean a person specially trained in advanced life support modules,
99 <u>numbers I, II and III as developed for the United States</u>
100 <u>Department of Transportation under Contract No. DOT-HS-900-089</u>, as
101 authorized by the Mississippi State Board of Health.

(d) "Emergency medical technician-paramedic" shall mean
a person specially trained in an advanced life support training
program authorized by the Mississippi State Board of Health.

(e) "Medical control" shall mean directions and advice
provided from a centrally designated medical facility staffed by
appropriate personnel, operating under medical supervision,
supplying professional support through radio or telephonic
communication for on-site and in-transit basic and advanced life
support services given by field and satellite facility personnel.
SECTION 4. Section 41-60-13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

112 amended as follows:

41-60-13. The Mississippi State Board of Health is 113 114 authorized to promulgate and enforce rules and regulations to provide for the best and most effective emergency medical care, 115 116 and to comply with national standards for advanced life support. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, advanced life support 117 118 personnel may be authorized to provide advanced life support 119 services as defined by rules and regulations promulgated by the State Board of Health. Rules and regulations promulgated pursuant 120 121 to this authority shall, as a minimum:

(a) Define and authorize appropriate functions and training programs for advanced life support trainees and personnel \* \* \*; provided, that all such training programs shall meet or exceed the performance requirements of the <u>current</u> training program for the emergency medical technician-paramedic,

(b) Specify minimum operational requirements which will
assure medical control over all advanced life support services.
(c) Specify minimum testing and certification
requirements and provide for continuing education and periodic
recertification for all advanced life support personnel.
SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from
