SENATE BILL NO. 2264

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI MILITARY LICENSE TAG DESIGN APPROVAL COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF SUCH
- COMMITTEE; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMITTEE SHALL APPROVE THE DESIGN OF CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAGS PRIOR TO THE MANUFACTURE OF 3
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- SUCH TAGS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54, 27-19-56.5 AND 27-19-56.13, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, IN
- 6
- CONFORMITY THERETO; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) There is hereby established the Mississippi 9
- 10 Military License Tag Design Approval Committee. The committee
- shall be composed of the Adjutant General and members appointed by 11
- the Adjutant General who shall be active or retired members from 12
- each branch of the United States Armed Forces, including the 13
- National Guard and Reserves. No motor vehicle license tags shall 14
- 15 be issued pursuant to Sections 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54,
- 27-19-56.5 and 27-19-56.13 unless the committee approves the 16
- 17 design of such tags before they are manufactured.
- The committee shall meet when necessary upon 18
- notification of the Adjutant General to approve or disapprove of 19
- 20 the design of motor vehicle license tags issued pursuant to
- Sections 27-19-51, 27-19-53, 27-19-54, 27-19-56.5 and 27-19-56.13. 21
- A quorum shall consist of a majority of the committee and 22
- 23 decisions of the committee shall be by a majority vote of those
- present and voting. 24
- The committee shall not approve any design which 25
- contains the color yellow or which does not contain the colors 26
- red, white and blue. 27
- 28 SECTION 2. Section 27-19-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 29

(1) In recognition of their many and varied 30 27-19-51. 31 patriotic services rendered the state, the United States and the citizens thereof, Mississippians who have completed an active duty 32 33 career with the Armed Forces of the United States and active duty 34 and retired members of the Army National Guard, Air National Guard 35 of Mississippi, and the United States Reserves, including both enlisted and officer personnel, upon application and subject to 36 the provisions of this section may be issued distinctive motor 37 vehicle license plates or tags identifying these persons with such 38 organizations. For the purposes of this section the term "Armed 39 40 Forces" includes the United States Merchant Marines and members thereof in maritime service during the period from December 7, 41 42 1941 to August 15, 1945. The distinctive plates or tags so issued shall comply with the provisions of Section 27-19-41 and shall be 43 of such color and design as may be agreed upon by the Mississippi 44 Military License Tag Design Approval Committee and the State Tax 45 46 Commission * * *. Each distinctive license plate shall bear the 47 words "National Guard" or the name of the appropriate armed service and need not bear prefixed numbers identifying the county 48 49 of issuance.

- The surviving spouse of any person who was issued a 50 (2) 51 distinctive license plate or tag under subsection (1) of this section because of completion of an active duty career with the 52 Armed Forces of the United States or because of retirement from 53 the Army National Guard, Air National Guard or United States 54 Reserves, or any prisoner of war issued a distinctive license 55 56 plate or tag under Section 27-19-54, shall be eligible to receive 57 the same type of distinctive license plate or tag which the deceased spouse was issued. 58
- 59 (3) The distinctive license plates here provided for shall
 60 be prepared by the State Tax Commission and shall be issued
 61 through the tax collectors of the several counties of the state in
 62 like manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags and

such officers shall be entitled to their regular fees for such 63 64 service. Applicants for such distinctive plates shall present to the issuing official proof of their membership in the Army 65 66 National Guard, Air National Guard of Mississippi, or United 67 States Reserves by means of certificate signed by the commanding 68 officer of such applicant on forms prescribed by the Adjutant General of Mississippi. Retired members of the Armed Forces of 69 70 the United States applying for such plates shall present to the issuing officials a copy of their active duty retirement orders or 71 other proof of retirement from active service with one of the 72 73 Armed Forces of the United States. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon and for personally or 74 jointly owned private passenger vehicles (to include station 75 wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered 76 77 in the name, or jointly in the name, of the member making application therefor, and when so issued to such applicant shall 78 be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard 79 80 license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle. In addition to use of such distinctive license plates or 81 82 tags on such personally or jointly owned vehicles, such distinctive plate or tag may be used on state-owned vehicles 83 84 operated by the State Military Department provided the prefix "MNG" is placed ahead of the number thereon. Motor vehicles for 85 which such distinctive license plates or tags are issued shall be 86 87 registered by the proper official as are other motor vehicles. The distinctive license plates issued hereunder shall 88 not be transferable between motor vehicle owners; and in the event 89 the owner of a vehicle bearing such distinctive plate shall sell, 90 trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate 91 shall be retained by the owner to whom issued and returned by the 92 93 owner to the tax collector of the county or the State Tax

Commission, as the case may be.

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- The Adjutant General is authorized to recognize not more 95 than one hundred (100) senior staff officers, commanders, command 96 sergeants major and senior enlisted advisors by designating the 97 issue of National Guard distinctive license plates or tags 98 99 numbered "1" through "100." These license plates or tags shall be retained by the individual so designated and may be transferred 100 101 between vehicles or individuals under procedures established by 102 the State Tax Commission. The Adjutant General is responsible for 103 furnishing the State Tax Commission necessary information to effect issue or transfer of these specially numbered license 104 105 plates or tags.
- (7) National Guard plates or tags shall be prepared and furnished for the licensing year commencing November 1, 1962, and annually thereafter. The Adjutant General shall furnish the State Tax Commission with an estimate of the number of such distinctive plates or tags required in each of the several counties of the state.
- 112 (8) The provisions of this section are supplementary to the 113 laws of this state pertaining to the licensing of motor vehicles 114 and nothing herein shall be construed as abridging or repealing 115 any of such laws.
- SECTION 3. Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 27-19-53. (1) Any legal resident of the State of 118 119 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the United States, and who is rated as having one hundred percent 120 (100%) permanent service-connected disability by the Veterans' 121 Administration is privileged to purchase annually one (1) motor 122 vehicle license plate or tag in his or her county of legal 123 residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) in total cost, 124 regardless of make or model of motor vehicle. The registration 125 126 year of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the

- 127 month in which application for registration is made, as provided
- 128 in Section 27-19-31.
- 129 (a) Not more than one (1) such motor vehicle license
- 130 plate or tag shall be issued to each such qualified veteran.
- 131 (b) This section pertains only to taxes or plates for
- 132 private passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks.
- 133 (c) Proof of ownership of each particular motor vehicle
- 134 for which a license plate or tag is requested must be shown at
- 135 time of application for such plate or tag.
- 136 (d) Vehicles owned by such veterans are hereby exempt
- 137 from all ad valorem and privilege taxes; however, the surviving
- 138 spouse of a deceased person who was issued a license plate or tag
- 139 under this section shall be entitled to apply for or retain a
- 140 license issued under this section and may continue annually to
- 141 renew registration for one (1) motor vehicle license plate or tag
- 142 under this section for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. At
- 143 the time of application or renewal registration, a surviving
- 144 spouse who desires to retain the distinctive plate or tag issued
- 145 under this section shall file with the county tax collector a
- 146 sworn statement that the spouse is unmarried. Any such vehicle
- 147 when so registered shall be exempt from all ad valorem and
- 148 privilege taxes.
- 149 (2) The State Tax Commission is directed to furnish each
- 150 veteran obtaining a license tag under subsection (1) an emblem,
- 151 which the veteran shall attach securely to the tag, showing that
- 152 the tag was issued to a disabled American veteran. The design of
- 153 the tag shall be approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag
- 154 Design Approval Committee.
- 155 (3) A license issued under this section shall not be
- 156 transferable to any other person.
- 157 (4) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of
- 158 this section, or attempting to secure benefits hereunder to which
- 159 he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon

- 160 conviction shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars
- 161 (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- SECTION 4. Section 27-19-54, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 163 amended as follows:
- 164 27-19-54. (1) Any legal resident of the State of
- 165 Mississippi who was a prisoner of war or who is a recipient of the
- 166 Congressional Medal of Honor is privileged to obtain one (1) motor
- 167 vehicle license plate or tag on an annual basis in his county of
- 168 legal residence. The registration year of such motor vehicle
- 169 shall commence the first day of the month in which application for
- 170 registration is made, as provided in Section 27-19-31, Mississippi
- 171 Code of 1972.
- 172 (2) This section pertains only to tags or plates for private
- 173 passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks.
- 174 (3) Proof of ownership of each particular motor vehicle for
- 175 which a license plate or tag is requested and proof that the owner
- 176 thereof is a former prisoner of war or a recipient of the
- 177 Congressional Medal of Honor must be shown at time of application
- 178 for such plate or tag. A certificate from the State Veterans
- 179 Affairs Board stating that said individual is a former prisoner of
- 180 war or a recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor shall be
- 181 sufficient proof.
- 182 (4) Vehicles owned by such former prisoners of war, a
- 183 recipient of the Congressional Medal of Honor or the unmarried
- 184 surviving spouse of any such person are hereby exempt from all
- 185 motor vehicle registration fees and privilege taxes.
- 186 (5) The State Tax Commission is directed to furnish to the
- 187 tax collector of each county a sufficient number of distinctive
- 188 motor vehicle license plates or tags which shall be of such color
- 189 and design as the State Tax Commission shall prescribe subject to
- 190 the approval of the Mississippi License Tag Commission and the
- 191 Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee, and in
- 192 accordance with the provisions of Section 27-19-41. * * *

- A license issued under this section shall not be 193 transferable to any other person; however, the surviving spouse of 194 a deceased person who was issued a license plate or tag under this 195 196 section shall be entitled to apply for or retain a license issued 197 under this section and may continue annually to renew registration for one (1) motor vehicle license plate or tag under this section 198 for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. At the time of 199 200 application or renewal registration, a surviving spouse who desires to retain the distinctive plate or tag issued under this 201 section shall file with the county tax collector a sworn statement 202 203 that the spouse is unmarried.
- Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of 204 205 this section, or attempting to secure benefits hereunder to which 206 he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than One Hundred Dollars 207 (\$100.00) nor more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). 208
 - As used in this section, the term "prisoner of war" (8) means any regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the military or naval forces of the United States who was held as a prisoner of war for any period of time by any government of any nation with which the United States has been at war; and it also means any regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the Armed Forces of the United States who was held as a prisoner of war for any period of time subsequent to June 25, 1950, by any hostile force with which the Armed Forces of the United States were actually engaged in armed conflict subsequent to such date and prior to August 21, 1954, or any person (military or civilian) assigned to duty on the U.S.S. Pueblo who was captured by the military forces of North Korea on January 23, 1968, and thereafter held prisoner by the government of North Korea for any period of time ending on or before December 23, 1968, except any person who, at any time, voluntarily,

knowingly and without duress, gave aid to or collaborated with or

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in any manner served any such hostile force; and it also means any 226 regularly appointed, enrolled, enlisted or inducted member of the 227 Armed Forces of the United States who was held as a prisoner of 228 229 war for any period of time during the Vietnam Conflict by any 230 force hostile to the United States, except any such member who, at 231 any time, voluntarily, knowingly and without duress, gave aid to or collaborated with, or in any manner served, such hostile force. 232 The term "Vietnam Conflict" relates to the period beginning 233 February 28, 1961, and ending on such date as shall thereafter be 234 determined by presidential proclamation or concurrent resolution 235 236 of the Congress. SECTION 5. Section 27-19-56.5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 237 238 amended as follows: 27-19-56.5. In recognition of the patriotic service rendered 239 by Mississippians who survived the attack on Pearl Harbor and by 240 Mississippians who are recipients of the Purple Heart Medal, any 241 such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor 242 243 vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as a Pearl Harbor survivor or a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive 244

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags. A tag fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), in addition to all other taxes and fees, shall be collected by the tax collector for the Pearl Harbor distinctive tag. Distinctive tags issued to Purple Heart Medal recipients under the provisions of this section shall be exempt from ad valorem taxes, privilege taxes and all other taxes and fees. The surviving spouse of a deceased person who was issued a Purple Heart Medal distinctive license plate or tag under this section shall be entitled to apply

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for or retain such license tag and may continue annually to renew 259 registration for one (1) such distinctive motor vehicle license 260 plate or tag for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. 261 262 time of application or renewal registration, a surviving spouse 263 who desires to retain such distinctive plate or tag shall file 264 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is unmarried, and any such vehicle when so registered shall not be 265 266 exempt from ad valorem taxes and privilege taxes. collector shall forward the additional fee of Fifteen Dollars 267 (\$15.00) charged for issuance of a Pearl Harbor distinctive tag to 268 269 the Tax Commission which shall deposit such fee to the credit of the State General Fund. An applicant for a distinctive tag under 270 this section shall present to the issuing official either (a) 271 written proof that the applicant is an honorably discharged former 272 member of one (1) of the Armed Forces of the United States and, 273 while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States, was 274 present during the attack on the island of Oahu, Territory of 275 276 Hawaii, on December 7, 1941, between the hours of 7:55 a.m. and 9:45 a.m., Hawaii time, or (b) written proof that the applicant is 277 278 a Purple Heart Medal recipient. The distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon a personally or jointly 279 280 owned private passenger vehicle (to include station wagons, 281 recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the person making application 282 283 therefor, and when issued to such person shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plate or 284 285 license tag normally issued for such vehicle. The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable 286 287 between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a 288 vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by 289 290 such owner and returned to the tax collector.

291 SECTION 6. Section 27-19-56.13, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 292 amended as follows:

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27-19-56.13. In recognition of the patriotic service rendered by Mississippians who are recipients of the Distinguished Flying Cross and the Air Medal, any such person is privileged to obtain one (1) distinctive motor vehicle license plate or tag identifying him as recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross or the Air Medal. The distinctive plates or tags shall be of a color and design designated by the Tax Commission and approved by the Mississippi Military License Tag Design Approval Committee.

The distinctive license plates shall be prepared by the Tax Commission and shall be issued through the tax collectors of the counties in the same manner as are other motor vehicle license plates or tags. An additional tag fee of Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) shall be collected by the tax collector for such license plates or tags and shall be forwarded to the State Tax Commission which shall deposit such fee to the credit of the State General Fund. An applicant for such distinctive plates shall present to the issuing official written proof that the applicant is a recipient of the Distinguished Flying Cross or the Air Medal. distinctive license plates or tags so issued shall be used only upon a personally or jointly owned private passenger vehicle (to include station wagons, recreational motor vehicles and pickup trucks) registered in the name, or jointly in the name, of the person making application therefor, and when issued to such person shall be used upon the vehicle for which issued in lieu of the standard license plate or license tag normally issued for such vehicle.

The distinctive license plates shall not be transferable between motor vehicle owners; and in the event the owner of a vehicle bearing a distinctive plate shall sell, trade, exchange or otherwise dispose of the vehicle, such plate shall be retained by such owner and returned to the tax collector.

324 SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from 325 and after July 1, 2001.
