SENATE BILL NO. 2415

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 11-46-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 EXPAND RECOVERY UNDER THE TORTS CLAIM ACT; AND FOR RELATED 3 PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 11-46-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

7 11-46-5. (1) Notwithstanding the immunity granted in 8 Section 11-46-3, or the provisions of any other law to the contrary, the immunity of the state and its political subdivisions 9 10 from claims for money damages arising out of the torts of such governmental entities and the torts of their employees while 11 12 acting within the course and scope of their employment is hereby waived from and after July 1, 1993, as to the state, and from and 13 after October 1, 1993, as to political subdivisions; provided, 14 however, immunity of a governmental entity in any such case shall 15 16 be waived only to the extent of the maximum amount of liability provided for in Section 11-46-15. 17

18 (2) For the purposes of this chapter, an employee shall not 19 be considered as acting within the course and scope of his 20 employment and a governmental entity shall not be liable or be 21 considered to have waived immunity for any conduct of its employee 22 if the employee's conduct constituted fraud, malice, libel, 23 slander, defamation or any criminal offense other than traffic 24 violations.

(3) For the purposes of this chapter and not otherwise, itshall be a rebuttable presumption that any act or omission of an

27 employee within the time and at the place of his employment is 28 within the course and scope of his employment.

29 (4) For the purposes of this chapter and not otherwise, 30 damage to beehives and related property when caused by black bears 31 shall be considered a tort on the part of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for which recovery may be had under 32 this chapter. 33 (5) Nothing contained in this chapter shall be construed to 34 waive the immunity of the state from suit in federal courts 35 guaranteed by the Eleventh Amendment to the Constitution of the 36 37 United States.

38 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 39 and after its passage.
