SENATE BILL NO. 2422

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH IN THE STATE TREASURY THE ELECTRONIC 1 GOVERNMENT SERVICES FUND INTO WHICH SHALL BE DEPOSITED 10% OF THE 2 ANNUAL LITIGATION SETTLEMENT PAYMENTS RECEIVED BY THE STATE BY 3 AMERICAN MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS (AMS) TO BE APPROPRIATED BY THE 4 5 LEGISLATURE FOR DEVELOPING AND PROVIDING ELECTRONIC GOVERNMENT SERVICES WITHIN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO ESTABLISH AN 6 7 ELECTRONIC GOVERNMENT SERVICES OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE EXPENDITURE OF SUCH FUNDS AND THE 8 9 DEVELOPMENT OF ELECTRONIC MEDIA GOVERNMENT SERVICES IN THE STATE; 10 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. (1) There is established in the State Treasury 12 the "Electronic Government Services Fund," into which shall be 13 14 deposited ten percent (10%) of the annual litigation settlement payments received by the State Tax Commission and the Mississippi 15 16 Department of Information Technology Services on behalf of the State of Mississippi by American Management Systems, Inc. (AMS), 17 for which the use or purpose for expenditure is not restricted by 18 the terms of the settlement. Any funds in the Electronic 19 Government Services Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not 20 lapse into the State General Fund, but shall be available for 21 expenditure in the subsequent fiscal year. The funds in the 22 23 Electronic Government Fund shall be available for expenditure 24 pursuant to specific appropriation by the Legislature beginning in fiscal year 2002, to the Mississippi Department of Information 25 Technology Services, and shall be expended exclusively for 26 27 developing and providing electronic media government services 28 within the State of Mississippi. 29 (2) There is hereby established an Electronic Government 30

the expenditure of funds for electronic government services 31 32 statewide and to initiate study, planning and coordination of 33 electronic government services within the State of Mississippi. The Electronic Government Oversight Committee shall be authorized 34 35 to approve the design on any state electronic media portal or 36 website published by any agency of state government. In addition, 37 the committee shall develop and make recommendations for all expenditures from the Electronic Government Services Fund to be 38 appropriated by the Legislature, in order to cut across state and 39 40 local governmental organizational structures and introduce self-service models for citizens through state websites and other 41 electronic services. The committee shall promote economic 42 development and efficient delivery of government services by 43 44 encouraging governmental and private sector entities to conduct 45 their business and transactions using electronic media. The Electronic Government Oversight Committee shall be composed of the 46 47 following: (a) the Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services, who shall be the 48 chairman of the committee; (b) the State Auditor; (c) the State 49 50 Treasurer; (d) the Secretary of State; (e) the Lieutenant Governor; (f) the Speaker of the House of Representatives; (g) two 51 52 (2) members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; (h) two (2) members of the House of Representatives appointed by 53 54 the Speaker of the House; and (i) one (1) member from the business 55 community appointed by the Governor who shall possess knowledge, skill and experience in electronic business services. 56 The 57 committee shall annually elect one (1) member to serve as vice 58 chairman of the committee, who shall act as chairman in the 59 absence of the chairman. The committee shall meet monthly or upon the call of the chairman, and shall make necessary reports and 60 61 recommendations to the Legislature and the appropriate agencies of 62 state government. All agencies of state government shall 63 cooperate with the committee in providing requested information, S. B. No. 2422 *SS26/R472.1* 01/SS26/R472.1 PAGE 2

and any E-Government task force previously organized through the 64 Department of Information Technology Services or the Office of the 65 Governor shall work closely with and provide information to the 66 67 committee and shall report to the committee at its request. The 68 Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services shall 69 provide administrative support for the committee. Nonlegislative members of the committee shall serve without compensation, but 70 71 shall be reimbursed from the Electronic Government Services fund for each day's official duties of the committee at the same per 72 diem as established by Section 25-3-69, and actual travel and 73 74 expenses as authorized by Section 25-3-41. Legislative members of the committee shall receive the same per diem and expense 75 76 reimbursement from the Electronic Government Services fund as for attending committee meetings when the Legislature is not in 77 regular session. 78

79 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 80 and after July 1, 2001.
