COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2422

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH IN THE STATE TREASURY THE ELECTRONIC 1 GOVERNMENT SERVICES FUND INTO WHICH SHALL BE DEPOSITED FUNDS 2 APPROPRIATED BY THE LEGISLATURE FOR DEVELOPING AND PROVIDING 3 ELECTRONIC GOVERNMENT SERVICES WITHIN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI; TO 4 ESTABLISH AN ELECTRONIC GOVERNMENT SERVICES OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE TO 5 MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE EXPENDITURE OF SUCH FUNDS AND THE 6 DEVELOPMENT OF ELECTRONIC MEDIA GOVERNMENT SERVICES IN THE STATE; 7 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) There is established in the State Treasury the "Electronic Government Services Fund," into which shall be 11 12 deposited specific funds appropriated by the Legislature for 13 developing and providing electronic government services within the State of Mississippi. Any funds in the Electronic Government 14 15 Services Fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, but shall be available for expenditure in the 16 subsequent fiscal year. The funds in the Electronic Government 17 Fund shall be available for expenditure pursuant to specific 18 19 appropriation by the Legislature beginning in fiscal year 2002, to 20 the Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services, and shall be expended exclusively for developing and providing 21 22 electronic media government services within the State of 23 Mississippi.

(2) There is hereby established an Electronic Government
Oversight Committee to monitor and make recommendations regarding
the expenditure of funds for electronic government services
statewide and to initiate study, planning and coordination of
electronic government services within the State of Mississippi.
The Electronic Government Oversight Committee shall be authorized

30 to approve the design on any state electronic media portal or 31 website published by any agency of state government. In addition, 32 the committee shall develop and make recommendations for all 33 expenditures from the Electronic Government Services Fund to be 34 appropriated by the Legislature, in order to cut across state and 35 local governmental organizational structures and introduce 36 self-service models for citizens through state websites and other electronic services. The committee shall promote economic 37 development and efficient delivery of government services by 38 39 encouraging governmental and private sector entities to conduct 40 their business and transactions using electronic media. The Electronic Government Oversight Committee shall be composed of the 41 following: (a) the Executive Director of the Mississippi 42 43 Department of Information Technology Services, who shall be the chairman of the committee; (b) the State Auditor; (c) the State 44 Treasurer; (d) the Secretary of State; (e) the Lieutenant 45 46 Governor; (f) the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and (g) 47 The committee shall annually elect one (1) member the Governor. to serve as vice chairman of the committee, who shall act as 48 49 chairman in the absence of the chairman. The committee shall meet monthly or upon the call of the chairman, and shall make necessary 50 51 reports and recommendations to the Legislature and the appropriate agencies of state government. All agencies of state government 52 53 shall cooperate with the committee in providing requested 54 information, and any E-Government task force previously organized through the Department of Information Technology Services or the 55 56 Office of the Governor shall work closely with and provide information to the committee and shall report to the committee at 57 its request. The Mississippi Department of Information Technology 58 Services shall provide administrative support for the committee. 59 60 Nonlegislative members of the committee shall serve without 61 compensation.
