SENATE BILL NO. 2578

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-16-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO DEVELOP AND ISSUE 3 CRITERIA FOR AN OCCUPATIONAL DIPLOMA FOR STUDENTS WITH 4 DISABILITIES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-16-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 37-16-11. (1) A student who has been properly classified, in accordance with rules established by the state board as 9 10 "educable mentally retarded," "trainable mentally retarded," 11 "deaf," "specific learning disabled," "physically handicapped whose ability to communicate orally or in writing is seriously 12 13 impaired" or "emotionally handicapped" shall not be required to meet all requirements of Section 37-16-7, and shall, upon meeting 14 15 all applicable requirements prescribed by the district school board, be awarded a special diploma in a form prescribed by the 16 17 state board; provided, however, that such special graduation requirements prescribed by the district school board shall include 18 19 minimum graduation requirements as prescribed by the state board. 20 Any such student who meets all special requirements of the 21 district school board for his exceptionality, but is unable to 22 meet the appropriate special state minimum requirements, shall be awarded a special certificate of completion in a form prescribed 23 24 by the state board. Nothing provided in this section, however, 25 shall be construed to limit or restrict the right of an 26 exceptional student solely to a special diploma. Any such student shall, upon proper request, be afforded the opportunity to fully 27

meet all requirements of Section 37-16-7 through the standard 28 procedures established therein and thereby qualify for a standard 29 diploma upon graduation. 30 31 (2) Beginning with the 2001-2002 school year, the State 32 Board of Education shall develop and issue criteria for a Mississippi Occupational Diploma for students having a disability 33 as defined by the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education 34 Act, and any such student shall, upon proper request, be afforded 35 the opportunity to fully meet such requirements and qualify for an 36 occupational diploma upon graduation. 37 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 38

39 and after July 1, 2001.
