SENATE BILL NO. 2599

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 51-1-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 PROVIDE THAT A PERSON CAN NOT USE AN ALL TERRAIN VEHICLE IN OR ON 2. PUBLIC WATERWAYS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 51-1-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 6 7 51-1-4. Such portions of all natural flowing streams in this 8 state having a mean annual flow of not less than one hundred (100) cubic feet per second, as determined and designated on appropriate 9 maps by the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality, shall 10 be public waterways of the state on which the citizens of this 11 12 state and other states shall have the right of free transport in the stream and its bed and the right to fish and engage in water 13 14 sports. Such persons exercising the rights herein granted shall do so at their own risk, and such persons shall not be entitled to 15 16 recover any damages against any owner of property along such public waterways or anyone using such property with permission of 17 18 the owner for any injury to or death of persons or damage to 19 property arising out of the exercise of rights herein granted, 20 other than those damages which may be recovered for intentional or 21 malicious torts or for gross or willful negligence against the owner of property, or anyone using such property with permission 22 23 of the owner. Nothing herein contained shall authorize anyone utilizing such public waterways, under the authority granted 24 hereby, to trespass upon adjacent lands or, to launch or land any 25 26 commercial or pleasure craft along or from the shore of such 2.7 waterways except at places established by public or private *SS01/R645*

28 entities for such purposes. The right of the public to use the 29 surface waters of public waterways does not include, without the 30 written permission of the landowner, the operation of all terrain vehicles in or on such waterways. Nothing herein contained shall 31 32 authorize any person utilizing said public waterways, under the 33 authority granted hereby, to disturb the banks or beds of such waterways or the discharge of any object or substance into such 34 waters or upon or across any lands adjacent thereto or to hunt or 35 fish or go on or across any adjacent lands under floodwaters 36 beyond the natural banks of the bed of the public waterway. 37 38 Floodwater which has overflowed the banks of a public waterway is not a part of the public waterway. 39 40 Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit the 41 construction of dams and reservoirs by the State of Mississippi or any of its agencies or political subdivisions, or riparian owners, 42 in the manner now or hereafter authorized by law, or in any way to 43 44 affect the rights of riparian landowners along such waterways 45 except as specifically provided hereinabove or to amend or repeal any law relating to pollution or water conservation, or to affect 46 47 in any manner the title to the banks and beds of any such stream 48 or the title to any minerals thereunder, or to restrict the mining 49 or extraction of such minerals or the right of ingress and egress 50 thereto. The provisions of this section limiting the liability of 51 52 owners of property along public waterways and persons using such property with permission of the owners shall not be construed to 53 54 limit any rights of claimants for damages under federal statutes 55 or acts applying to navigable streams or waterways or any other civil causes of action subject to admiralty or maritime 56 jurisdiction, nor shall said provisions be construed to limit the 57 58 rights of any parties involved in litigation founded upon the 59 commercial or business usage of any navigable streams or 60 waterways.
