COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2616

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 97-9-73, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 CREATE THE CRIME OF FLEEING OR ELUDING A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER 2 IN A MOTOR VEHICLE; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 SECTION 1. Section 97-9-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 5 amended as follows: 6 97-9-73. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to 7 obstruct or resist by force, or violence, or threats, or in any 8 other manner, his lawful arrest or the lawful arrest of another 9 person by any state, local or federal law enforcement officer, and 10 any person or persons so doing shall be quilty of a misdemeanor, 11 and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not 12 13 more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not more than six (6) months, or both. 14 (2) The driver of a motor vehicle who is given a visible or 15 audible signal by a law enforcement officer by hand, voice, 16 emergency light or siren directing the driver to bring his motor 17 18 vehicle to a stop when such signal is given by a law enforcement officer acting in the lawful performance of duty who has a 19 reasonable suspicion to believe that the driver in question has 20 21 committed a crime, and who willfully fails to obey such direction, 22 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) 23 or imprisoned in the county jail for a term not to exceed one (1) 24 year, or both. It shall not be unlawful for a person driving a 25

motor vehicle after dusk to proceed to the nearest well-lit

- long as the driver does not exceed the speed limit.
