1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 29-5-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHARLOTTE CAPERS BUILDING AND THE WILLIAM F. WINTER ARCHIVES AND HISTORY BUILDING SHALL BE UNDER THE GENERAL SUPERVISION AND CARE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION; TO AMEND SECTION 29-5-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION HAS JURISDICTION OVER THE CHARLOTTE CAPERS BUILDING AND THE WILLIAM F. WINTER ARCHIVES AND HISTORY BUILDING; TO AMEND SECTION 29-17-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCLUDE THE CHARLOTTE CAPERS BUILDING AND THE WILLIAM F. WINTER ARCHIVES AND HISTORY BUILDING IN THE DEFINITION OF THE CAPITOL COMPLEX; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
14	SECTION 1. Section 29-5-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
15	amended as follows:
16	29-5-2. The duties of the * * * Department of Finance and
17	Administration shall be as follows:
18	(a) (i) To exercise general supervision and care over
19	and keep in good condition the following state property located in
20	the City of Jackson: the New State Capitol Building, the Woolfolk
21	State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin Justice Building, the
22	Walter Sillers Office Building, the War Veterans' Memorial
23	Building, the Charlotte Capers Building, the William F. Winter
24	Archives and History * * * Building, the Ike Sanford Veterans
25	Affairs Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the Governor's
26	Mansion, the Heber Ladner Building, the Burroughs Building, the
27	Robert E. Lee Office Building, the Robert E. Lee Parking Garage,
28	the Manship House Restoration and Visitor Center, the State
29	Records Center, the 301 Lamar Street Building, and all other

properties acquired in the same transaction at the time of the

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purchase of the Robert E. Lee Hotel property from the First

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- 32 Federal Savings and Loan Association of Jackson, Mississippi,
- 33 which properties are more particularly described in a warranty
- 34 deed heretofore executed and delivered on April 22, 1969, and
- 35 filed for record in the office of the Chancery Clerk of the First
- 36 Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi, located in
- 37 Jackson, Mississippi, on April 25, 1969, at 9:00 a.m., and
- 38 recorded in Deed Book No. 1822, page 136 et seq., and the Central
- 39 High Building and 101 Capitol Centre.
- 40 (ii) To exercise general supervision and care over
- 41 and keep in good condition the Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building
- 42 located in Biloxi, Mississippi.
- 43 (iii) To exercise general supervision and care
- 44 over and keep in good condition the State Service Center, located
- 45 at the intersection of State Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum
- 46 Industrial Drive in Hattiesburg, Mississippi.
- 47 (b) To assign suitable office space for the various
- 48 state departments, officers and employees who are provided with an
- 49 office in any of the buildings under the jurisdiction or control
- of the $\underline{\text{Department of Finance and Administration}}$. However, the
- 51 assignment of space in the New Capitol Building shall be
- 52 designated by duly passed resolution of the combined Senate Rules
- 53 Committee and the House Management Committee, meeting as a joint
- 54 committee, approved by the Lieutenant Governor and Speaker of the
- 55 House of Representatives. A majority vote of the members of the
- 56 Senate Rules Committee and a majority vote of the members of the
- 57 House Management Committee shall be required on all actions taken,
- 58 resolutions or reports adopted, and all other matters considered
- 59 by the full combined committee on occasions when the Senate Rules
- 60 Committee and the House Management Committee shall meet as a full
- 61 combined committee.
- 62 (c) To approve or disapprove * * * with the concurrence
- 63 of the Public Procurement Review Board, any lease or rental

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64 agreements by any state agency or department, including any state

- 65 agency financed entirely by federal and special funds, for space
- outside the buildings under the jurisdiction of the Department of
- 67 Finance and Administration. In no event shall any employee,
- 68 officer, department, federally funded agency or bureau of the
- 69 state be authorized to enter a lease or rental agreement without
- 70 prior approval of the Department of Finance and Administration and
- 71 the Public Procurement Review Board.
- 72 The Department of Finance and Administration is authorized to
- 73 use architects, engineers, building inspectors and other personnel
- 74 for the purpose of making inspections as may be deemed necessary
- 75 in carrying out its duties and maintaining the facilities.
- 76 (d) To acquire by lease, lease-purchase agreement, or
- 77 otherwise, as provided in Section 27-104-107, and to assign
- 78 through the Office of General Services, by lease or sublease
- 79 agreement from the office, and with the concurrence of the Public
- 80 Procurement Review Board, to any state agency or department,
- 81 including any state agency financed entirely by federal and
- 82 special funds, appropriate office space in the buildings acquired.
- 83 SECTION 2. Section 29-5-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 84 amended as follows:
- 85 29-5-81. Grounds of public buildings over which the
- 86 Department of Finance and Administration has jurisdiction shall
- 87 comprise the following:
- 88 (a) In the City of Jackson, Mississippi:
- New State Capitol: Bounded on the north by High Street, on
- 90 the west by North West Street, on the south by Mississippi Street,
- 91 and on the east by North President Street;
- Governor's Mansion: Bounded on the north by Amite Street, on
- 93 the west by North West Street, on the south by Capitol Street and
- 94 on the east by North Congress Street;
- 95 Woolfolk State Office Building: Bounded on the north by High
- 96 Street, on the west by Lamar Street, on the south by Hamilton
- 97 Street and on the east by North West Street;
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- 98 Old State Capitol and War Veterans' Memorial Building
- 99 Complex: Bounded on the north by Amite Street, on the west by
- 100 North State Street and South State Street, on the south by Pearl
- 101 Street and on the east by property of the Gulf, Mobile and Ohio
- 102 Railroad Company;
- 103 Carroll Gartin Justice Building and Walter Sillers Office
- 104 Building Complex: Bounded on the north by George Street, on the
- 105 west by North West Street, on the south by High Street and on the
- 106 east by North President Street;
- 107 Heber Ladner Building: Bounded on the north by Mississippi
- 108 Street, on the west by North Congress Street, on the south by the
- 109 property of Galloway Methodist Church used as a parking lot and on
- 110 the east by the property on which the Mississippi Farm Bureau
- 111 Federation Building stands;
- 112 State Board of Health Building: Bounded on the north by
- 113 Stadium Drive, on the west by the property of Mississippi Hospital
- 114 and Medical Service, on the southwest by property on which is
- 115 located a Standard Oil service station, on the southeast by
- 116 property leased by the Mississippi Federation of Women's Clubs and
- 117 on the east by North State Street;
- Robert E. Lee Building and other properties acquired in the
- 119 same transaction: Particularly described in warranty deed
- 120 executed and delivered on April 22, 1969, and filed for record in
- 121 the Office of the Chancery Clerk of the First Judicial District of
- 122 Hinds County, Mississippi, located in Jackson, Mississippi, on
- 123 April 25, 1969, at 9:00 a.m., and recorded in deed book No. 1822,
- 124 page 136, et seq.;
- 125 <u>Charlotte Capers</u> Building: Bounded on the north by the Old
- 126 Capitol Building, on the west by South State Street, on the south
- 127 by Pearl Street, and on the east by the Illinois Central Railroad
- 128 tracks;

- 129 William F. Winter Archives and History Building: Bounded on
- 130 the north by Mississippi Street; on the west by North Street, on
- 131 the south by Amite Street, and on the east by Jefferson Street.
- Mayfair Building: Bounded on the north by George Street, on
- 133 the west by Northwest Street, on the south by Walter Sillers
- 134 Office Building complex, and on the east by North President
- 135 Street;
- 136 Court of Appeals Building: Bounded on the west by North
- 137 State Street, on the north by George Street, on the east by North
- 138 Street, and on the south by the building designated as 654 North
- 139 State Street, including the parking area east of and adjacent to
- 140 the 654 North State Street Building;
- 141 Central High Building;
- 142 101 Capitol Centre: Located at 101 West Capitol Street,
- 143 Jackson, Mississippi.
- 144 (b) The Dr. Eldon Langston Bolton Building: Located in the
- 145 City of Biloxi, Mississippi.
- 146 (c) The State Service Center: Located at the intersection
- 147 of State Highway 49 and John Merl Tatum Industrial Drive in the
- 148 City of Hattiesburg, Mississippi.
- SECTION 3. Section 29-17-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 150 amended as follows:
- 29-17-1. As used in this chapter, the following words shall
- 152 have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context clearly
- 153 requires otherwise:
- 154 (a) "Public facility" shall mean any building or other
- 155 facility owned by the State of Mississippi, or by any agency,
- 156 department or political subdivision of the State of Mississippi,
- 157 which is occupied, used or under the control of the State of
- 158 Mississippi, or any agency or department of the State of
- 159 Mississippi, or any junior college district of the State of
- 160 Mississippi, or the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 161 Higher Learning of the State of Mississippi, or any institution

162	under the jurisdiction of the Board of Trustees of State
163	Institutions of Higher Learning of the State of Mississippi.
164	(b) "Capitol complex" shall include the following state
165	property located in Jackson, Mississippi: the New State Capitol
166	Building, the Woolfolk State Office Building, the Carroll Gartin
167	Justice Building, the Walter Sillers Office Building, the War
168	Veterans' Memorial Building, the <u>Charlotte Capers</u> Building, <u>the</u>
169	William F. Winter Archives and History Building, the Ike Sanford
170	Veterans Affairs Building, the Old State Capitol Building, the
171	Governor's Mansion, the Heber Ladner Building, the Burroughs
172	Building, the Robert E. Lee Hotel Property, the Central High
173	Legislative Services Building, the 301 Building or any other
174	properties which may come under the supervision of the Department
175	of Finance and Administration and are deemed to be in the Capitol
176	Complex.
177	SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
178	and after its passage.
