SENATE BILL NO. 2826

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 63-1-35, 63-1-81 AND 63-1-82, 2 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO MAKE PROVISION FOR ISSUANCE OF A 3 DRIVER'S LICENSE TO THOSE NOT ENTITLED TO ISSUANCE OF A SOCIAL 4 SECURITY NUMBER; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 63-1-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

63-1-35. (1) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall 8 prescribe the form of licenses issued pursuant to this article 9 10 which shall, among other features, include a driver's license number assigned by the Department of Public Safety which, at the 11 option of the licensee, may or may not be the Social security 12 13 number of the licensee. A licensee who chooses not to use his Social security number as his driver's license number shall list 14 15 his Social security number with the department which shall cross reference the Social security number with the driver's license 16 number for purposes of identification, subject to subsection (2) 17 of this section. Additionally, each license shall bear a full 18 19 face color photograph of the licensee in such form that the 20 license and the photograph cannot be separated. Such photograph 21 shall be taken so that one (1) exposure will photograph the 22 applicant and the application simultaneously on the same film. The department shall use a process in the issuance of a license 23 24 with a color photograph which shall prevent as nearly as possible 25 any alteration, counterfeiting, duplication, reproduction, forging 26 or modification of such license or the superimposition of a photograph without ready detection. Such photograph shall be 27

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28 replaced every four (4) years by the department at the time of 29 renewal. (2) In lieu of a social security number for an applicant not 30 entitled to one, an application for a driver's license may be 31 32 accompanied by: 33 (a) An SSA L-676 letter issued by the United States Social Security Administration stating that the applicant is 34 ineligible to obtain a social security number; 35 (b) A temporary identification number issued to the 36 applicant by the United States Internal Revenue Service; or 37 38 (c) An affidavit of the applicant stating that the applicant has not been issued a social security number, SSA L-676 39 40 letter, or temporary identification number. The affidavit must be sworn to and subscribed by the applicant before a notary public of 41 this state in substantially the following form: 42 "Ι, _, swear under penalty of perjury that I have 43 44 not been issued a social security number or an SSA L-676 letter by the United State Social Security Administration or a temporary 45 identification number by the United States Internal Revenue 46 47 Service." SECTION 2. Section 63-1-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 48 49 amended as follows: 50 63-1-81. (1) Each application for a commercial driver's license or commercial driver instruction permit shall include the 51 52 following: (a) The full name and the current mailing and 53 54 residential address of the applicant; A physical description of the applicant, including 55 (b) sex, height, weight, eye and hair color; 56 57 (C) The applicant's date of birth; 58 (d) The applicant's Social Security number unless the 59 application is for a nonresident commercial driver's license or 60 unless subsection (6) applies; *SS02/R1119* S. 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(e) The applicant's signature;

62 (f) The applicant's color photograph;

63 (g) All certifications required by applicable federal64 regulations;

(h) Any other information which the Commissioner of
Public Safety, by rule or regulation, determines necessary and
essential; and

68 (i) The consent of the applicant to release driving69 record information.

70 (2) The fee for accepting and processing an application for
71 a commercial driver instruction permit shall be Ten Dollars
72 (\$10.00).

73 (3) The fee for accepting and processing an application for
74 a Class A, B or C commercial driver's license shall be Twenty-five
75 Dollars (\$25.00).

(4) No person who has been a resident of this state for thirty (30) days may drive a commercial motor vehicle under the authority of a commercial driver's license issued by another jurisdiction. Any violation of this subsection shall be punishable as provided by Section 63-1-69, Mississippi Code of 1972.

(5) Any person who knowingly falsifies information or
certifications required under subsection (1) of this section shall
be subject to the penalties prescribed in Section 63-1-59,
Mississippi Code of 1972, and shall be subject to suspension of
his commercial driver instruction permit or commercial driver's
license in accordance with Section 63-1-51, Mississippi Code of
1972.

89 (6) Each application or filing made under this section shall 90 include the Social Security number(s) of the applicant in 91 accordance with Section 93-11-64,*** <u>or, for applicants not</u> 92 <u>entitled to a social security number:</u>

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(a) An SSA L-676 letter issued by the United States 93 94 Social Security Administration stating that the applicant is ineligible to obtain a social security number; 95 96 (b) A temporary identification number issued to the 97 applicant by the United States Internal Revenue Service; or (c) An affidavit of the applicant stating that the 98 applicant has not been issued a social security number, SSA L-676 99 letter, or temporary identification number. The affidavit must be 100 101 sworn to and subscribed by the applicant before a notary public of this state in substantially the following form: 102 103 _, swear under penalty of perjury that I have "Ι, 104 not been issued a social security number or an SSA L-676 letter by 105 the United State Social Security Administration or a temporary 106 identification number by the United States Internal Revenue 107 Service." 108 SECTION 3. Section 63-1-82, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 109 amended as follows: 110 63-1-82. (1) Each commercial driver's license shall be marked "Commercial Driver's License" or "CDL," and shall, to the 111 112 maximum extent practicable, be tamper proof. Each such license shall include thereon, but not be limited to, the following 113 114 information: The name and residential address of the licensee; 115 (a) 116 (b) The licensee's color photograph; 117 A physical description of the licensee, including (C) his sex, height, weight, eye and hair color; 118 The licensee's date of birth; 119 (d) Except for a nonresident commercial driver's 120 (e) license, the licensee's Social Security or other identifying 121 122 number; and any other identifying information which the Commissioner of Public Safety, by rule or regulation, determines 123 124 necessary and essential for the purposes of complying with the 125 provisions of this article; *SS02/R1119* S. 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(f) The licensee's signature;

127 (g) The class or type of commercial motor vehicle or 128 vehicles which the licensee is authorized to drive together with 129 any endorsements or restrictions;

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(h) The name of this state; and

The dates between which the license is valid. 131 (i) The holder of a valid commercial driver's license may 132 (2) 133 drive all vehicles in the class for which that license is issued and all lesser classes of vehicles, including any vehicle for 134 which an operator's license or commercial driver's license issued 135 136 under Article 1 of this chapter authorizes a person to drive. 137 However, vehicles which require an endorsement may not be driven 138 unless the proper endorsement appears on the license.

139 (3) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with the140 following classifications:

(a) Class A. Any combination of vehicles with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or more, provided the gross vehicle weight rating of the vehicle or vehicles being towed is in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds;

(b) Class B. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating of twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds or more, and any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds;

(c) Class C. Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle
weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one (26,001) pounds
or any such vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight
rating not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds comprising:
(i) Vehicles designed to transport sixteen (16) or
more passengers, including the driver; and

156 (ii) Vehicles used in the transportation of157 hazardous materials which are required to be placarded under the

(d) Class D. All other vehicles or combination of
vehicles which are not included in Class A, Class B or Class C and
for which a commercial license is required to be issued as
provided by Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972.

164 (4) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with the 165 following endorsements and restrictions:

166 (a) "H" authorizes the driver to drive a vehicle167 transporting hazardous materials;

168 (b) "K" restricts the driver to vehicles not equipped 169 with air brakes;

170 (c) "T" authorizes driving double and triple trailers; 171 (d) "P" authorizes driving vehicles carrying 172 passengers;

(e) "N" authorizes driving tank vehicles; and
(f) "X" represents a combination of hazardous materials
and tank vehicle endorsements.

(g) "S" restricts the driver to school buses being operated for the purpose of transporting pupils to and from school or to school-related functions and/or to all other vehicles not requiring a commercial driver's license.

180 (5) Before issuing a commercial driver's license, the
181 Commissioner of Public Safety shall obtain driving record
182 information through the Commercial Driver License Information
183 System.

184 (6) Within ten (10) days after issuing a commercial driver's
185 license, the Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify the
186 Commercial Driver License Information System of that fact,
187 providing all information required to ensure identification of the
188 person.

189 (7) The fee charged for the issuance of each original and 190 each renewal of a Class A, B or C commercial driver's license S. B. No. 2826 *SSO2/R1119* 01/SS02/R1119 PAGE 6 191 shall be Forty Dollars (\$40.00). In addition, a fee of Five 192 Dollars (\$5.00) shall be charged for each endorsement or 193 restriction entered on a commercial driver's license under 194 subsection (4) of this section. However, the fee charged for each 195 original and renewal of a commercial driver's license with an "S" 196 restriction shall be the same as the fee for a Class D commercial 197 driver's license in addition to all application fees.

198 (8) If a commercial driver instruction permit or commercial 199 driver's license is lost or destroyed, or if the holder of a 200 commercial driver's license changes his name, mailing address or 201 residence, an application for a duplicate permit or license shall 202 be made as provided by Section 63-1-37, Mississippi Code of 1972.

(9) All commercial driver's licenses issued under the provisions of this article shall be issued for a period of not more than four (4) years and shall expire at midnight on the last day of the licensee's month of birth.

(10) Every person applying for renewal of a commercial
driver's license shall complete the application form required by
Section 63-1-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, providing updated
information and required certifications and paying the appropriate
fees. If the applicant wishes to retain a hazardous materials
endorsement, the written test for a hazardous materials
endorsement must be taken and passed.

214 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 215 and after September 1, 2001.
