SENATE BILL NO. 2916 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-143-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO EXPAND THE MEDICAL EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO INCLUDE A 2 LOAN REPAYMENT PROGRAM FOR FAMILY MEDICINE PHYSICIANS AGREEING TO 3 SERVE IN A PRIMARY CARE CRITICAL NEEDS SHORTAGE AREA, TO AUTHORIZE 4 THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING TO 5 USE FUNDS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE SCHOLARSHIP AND LOAN REPAYMENT 6 7 PROGRAM TO SECURE FEDERAL MATCHING FUNDS TO ASSIST IN REPAYING EDUCATIONAL LOANS FOR PRIMARY HEALTH CARE CLINICIANS AGREEING TO 8 PRACTICE IN PRIMARY CARE CRITICAL NEEDS SHORTAGE AREAS, AND TO 9 REQUIRE NO LESS THAN EIGHT YEARS SERVICE IN EXCHANGE FOR LOAN 10 11 REPAYMENTS THROUGH THE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

13 SECTION 1. Section 37-143-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

14 amended as follows:

15 37-143-6. (1) There is established a medical education 16 scholarship and loan repayment program, which shall be administered by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 17 Higher Learning. Each year, the program shall provide a certain 18 number of eligible applicants, if the applicant meets the 19 20 conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment is 21 granted, with: (a) a full scholarship to obtain a medical 22 education at the University of Mississippi School of Medicine at no cost to the recipient; or (b) funds for repaying state and 23 24 federal medical education loans.

(2) The program shall provide scholarships <u>or loan</u>
<u>repayments</u> to up to twenty (20) new recipients each year, <u>of which</u>
<u>no more than ten (10) may be recipients of loan repayments</u>. The
program shall be funded from monies appropriated from the Health
Care Expendable Fund established under Section 43-13-407 * * *.
The amounts that may be expended annually for scholarships <u>and</u>

31 <u>loan repayments</u> under the program shall not exceed the following: 32 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in fiscal year 2001; 33 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2002; One 34 Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) in fiscal 35 year 2003; and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) in fiscal year 36 2004 and in any later fiscal year.

A scholarship awarded under this program shall be in an 37 (3) 38 amount that will pay the full cost of attendance, as defined by federal law and regulation, at the University of Mississippi 39 40 School of Medicine for the entire time necessary for the recipient to complete the requirements for a medical degree. The actual 41 amount of the scholarship shall be determined by the Office of 42 43 Financial Aid of the University of Mississippi Medical Center but 44 shall not exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) per 45 year for any recipient.

Before being granted a scholarship, each applicant shall 46 (4) 47 enter into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be deemed a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the 48 terms and conditions upon which the scholarship will be granted. 49 50 In order to receive a scholarship under the program, the recipient 51 must agree in the contract to practice family medicine for a 52 period of not less than ten (10) years after completion of his or her residency in an area of the state that is a critical needs 53 54 area for primary medical care at the time of the recipient's entry 55 into medical practice. The determination and designation of the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary 56 57 medical care in which scholarship recipients may practice shall be 58 made by a committee to be known as the Medical Care Critical Needs 59 Committee, which shall be composed of the following persons: the Vice Chancellor for Health Affairs of the University of 60 Mississippi Medical Center, who shall be chairman of the 61 62 committee; the Executive Director of the State Department of Health; the Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid; the 63 *SS26/R1217SG* S. 64 President of the Mississippi State Medical Association or his 65 designee; the President of the Mississippi State Hospital 66 Association or his designee; the President of the Mississippi 67 Academy of Family Physicians; and the Executive Director of the 68 Mississippi Primary Health Care Association. The committee shall 69 meet at least once annually to determine and designate the areas of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical 70 71 care in which scholarship recipients may practice family medicine in order to fulfill their contractual obligation. 72

(a) Beginning on July 1, 2001, the Board of Trustees of 73 (5) 74 State Institutions of Higher Learning may use any funds available 75 under the medical education scholarship and loan repayment program 76 for repaying state and federal medical education loans made to 77 licensed family medicine physicians who agree to practice family medicine for a period of not less than eight (8) years in an area 78 of the state that is a critical needs area for primary medical 79 80 care, as designated by the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee. 81 The board of trustees shall use such funds to apply for and receive federal matching funds from the National Health Service 82 83 Corps to assist in the repayment of qualified educational loans 84 for primary health care clinicians who agree to practice in a 85 critical needs area for primary medical care. In order to receive a state loan repayment under this section, an applicant must enter 86 into a contract with the board of trustees, which shall be deemed 87 88 a contract with the State of Mississippi, agreeing to the terms and conditions upon which the loan repayment will be granted. The 89 90 contract must include all conditions specified under subsection (4) for scholarship recipients; however, for a loan repayment, the 91 minimum period of service required in an area of the state that is 92 a critical needs area for primary medical care at the time the 93 94 contract is executed is eight (8) years. The contract also must 95 specify the total amount of the loan repayment and a schedule for

96 making payments to the recipient, based upon the recommendation of 97 the Medical Care Critical Needs Committee. (b) The board of trustees shall give priority in 98 99 awarding loan repayments to family medicine physicians according 100 to the following: 101 (i) University of Mississippi School of Medicine graduates or persons who have completed successfully a full 102 103 three-year family medicine residency training program in the State 104 of Mississippi; 105 (ii) Persons who were born in Mississippi who have 106 completed training in a certified family medicine residency 107 program outside the State of Mississippi; and 108 (iii) Physicians who are practicing outside the 109 State of Mississippi who received training at a medical school 110 outside the state and who are board certified in family practice. (c) The Medical Care Critical Needs Committee shall 111 meet at least once annually to determine and designate the areas 112 113 of the state that are critical needs areas for primary medical care in which loan repayment recipients may practice family 114 115 medicine and other primary care health professional disciplines in order to fulfill their contractual obligation. The committee also 116 117 shall determine the priority of additional primary health care clinicians who are eligible to participate in the state loan 118 repayment program using any National Health Service Corps matching 119 120 funds or other funds excluding funds appropriated by the 121 Legislature. (6) If a scholarship recipient leaves the University of 122 Mississippi School of Medicine before graduation, or leaves his or 123 her residency before completion, or fails to practice family 124 125 medicine for a period of ten (10) years in a critical needs area 126 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 127 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (4) of this section, the 128 full amount that the recipient received under the scholarship *SS26/R1217SG* S. shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 129 130 interest. If a loan repayment recipient fails to practice family medicine for a period of eight (8) years in a critical needs area 131 132 for primary medical care as designated by the Medical Care 133 Critical Needs Committee under subsection (5)(c) of this section, 134 the full amount that the recipient received for loan repayments shall be due and payable within ninety (90) days, together with 135 interest. The amount of interest due shall be equal to the annual 136 137 rate of return on the Health Care Trust Fund established under Section 43-13-405 for each year from the time the recipient 138 139 received the scholarship or loan repayment money until the time the scholarship or loan repayment money is repaid. The board of 140 141 trustees may bring suit against any scholarship or loan repayment 142 recipient to recover the amount due to the state under this section for the recipient's failure to comply with the conditions 143 144 upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was granted, as provided in this section and in the contract between the recipient 145 146 and the board of trustees. The board of trustees is authorized to postpone or forgive the repayment of all or part of the amount 147 148 that a recipient received under the scholarship or for loan repayments and the interest that would otherwise be due under this 149 150 subsection if the recipient's failure to comply with the 151 conditions upon which the scholarship or loan repayment was granted was due to circumstances beyond the recipient's control 152 153 that caused the recipient to be physically unable to comply with those conditions, such as suffering a severe illness, injury or 154 155 other disabling condition. (7) The board of trustees shall establish such rules and 156 regulations, based upon recommendations submitted by the Medical 157

158 <u>Care Critical Needs Committee, which</u> it deems necessary and proper

159 to carry out the purposes and intent of this section.

160 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 161 and after July 1, 2001.
