COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2937

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, WITH THE 1 COOPERATION OF THE STATE VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD, TO DEVISE AND 2 3 IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM WHICH AWARDS FULL HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMAS TO 4 QUALIFYING WORLD WAR II VETERANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 WHEREAS, during the 1940's, thousands of young men and women across the United States left high school to serve valorously in 6 the armed forces during World War II; and 7 WHEREAS, the sacrifices of these young men and women earned 8 9 America its freedom, helped the United States gain status as a superpower, and shaped the course of history throughout the entire 10 world; and 11 WHEREAS, after World War II ended, many of these brave 12 veterans were unable to finish high school for various reasons, 13 but they led productive lives and served their communities 14 throughout their lifetimes; and 15 WHEREAS, awarding high school diplomas to qualifying World 16 War II veterans would be a small and overdue gesture of our 17 society's profound gratitude for the sacrifice these courageous 18 individuals made in the name of freedom; NOW, THEREFORE, 19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 2.0 SECTION 1. The State Department of Education, with the 21 cooperation of the State Veterans' Affairs Board, shall devise and 22 23 implement a program which awards full high school diplomas to qualifying World War II veterans. The purpose of the program is 24 to award high school diplomas to World War II veterans who left 25 26 high school prior to graduation to enter United States military service. The department and the board shall jointly develop an 27

application procedure, distribute applications and publicize the

- 29 program. All honorably discharged World War II veterans who are
- 30 residents or former residents of the state, who served between
- 31 September 16, 1940, and December 31, 1946, and who did not return
- 32 to school and complete their education after the war shall be
- 33 eligible to receive a diploma. Diplomas may be issued
- 34 posthumously. Upon approval of an application, the local school
- 35 board shall issue a standard high school diploma for an eligible
- 36 veteran from the veteran's school of attendance or from the
- 37 existing high school which the veteran would have attended. The
- 38 diploma shall clearly indicate that the recipient is a veteran of
- 39 World War II and that the diploma was issued at a later date due
- 40 to the veteran's participation in the war. The State Department
- 41 of Education and the State Veteran Affairs Board shall work
- 42 together to provide communities with information about hosting a
- 43 diploma ceremony on or around Veterans Day. The diploma shall be
- 44 mailed to the veteran or, if the veteran is deceased, to the
- 45 veteran's family.
- 46 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 47 and after July 1, 2001.
