SENATE BILL NO. 2945

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE COUNTIES WHICH PARTICIPATE IN AN 1 INTERGOVERNMENTAL RADIO COMMUNICATION PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE 2 DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES TO ASSESS AN 3 ADDITIONAL SURCHARGE UPON ANY MOVING TRAFFIC VIOLATION; TO PROVIDE 4 THAT THE SURCHARGE SHALL BE USED BY THE COUNTY TO FUND ONLY THAT 5 COUNTY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERGOVERNMENTAL RADIO 6 COMMUNICATION PROGRAM TO PURCHASE PUBLIC SAFETY WIRELESS 7 COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 SECTION 1. (1) In addition to any other monetary penalties and any other penalties imposed by law, any county which 11 12 participates in an intergovernmental radio communication program 13 approved by the Department of Information Technology Services may assess an additional surcharge in an amount not to exceed Fifteen 14 15 Dollars (\$15.00) from each person upon whom a court imposes a fine or other penalty for any violation in Title 63, Mississippi Code 16 of 1972, except offenses relating to vehicular parking or 17 registration. The surcharge shall be used by the county to fund 18 19 only that county's participation in the intergovernmental radio 20 communication program to purchase public safety wireless communications systems. 21 22 (2) Approval of an intergovernmental radio communication 23 program shall be given by the Department of Information Technology 24 Services when: 25 (a) The program includes the sharing of support

26 facilities (e.g., towers, shelters, microwave, etc.) by

27 participating entities; or

(b) The program includes the establishment of a mutual aid system using common radio frequency channels between participating entities; or (c) The program sets forth a feasible methodology which

32 utilizes the radio frequency spectrum in an efficient manner.
33 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
34 and after its passage.
