SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 534

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE LIFE OF FORMER FIRST
2 LADY OF MISSISSIPPI DOROTHY P. JOHNSON, AND EXPRESSING THE
3 SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.

4 WHEREAS, former First Lady of Mississippi Dorothy P. Johnson
5 of Hattiesburg, Mississippi, died August 26, 2000; and

6 WHEREAS, "Dot," as she was known, was the widow of former
7 Governor Paul B. Johnson, Jr., who served from 1964-1968; and

8 WHEREAS, she was born in Red Banks, Mississippi, to Octie
9 Kizer and Shelby Reeves Power; she was a graduate from the
10 University of Mississippi where she was chosen "Ole Miss Beauty"
11 and met her husband, Paul B. Johnson, Jr.; she was active in DAR
12 and served as the state president; Dot loved to cook and wrote and
13 published a cookbook with many of her special dishes; she was a
14 charter member of Parkway Heights Methodist Church in Hattiesburg,
15 Mississippi; and

16 WHEREAS, she was preceded in death by her husband, former
17 Governor Paul B. Johnson, Jr., a daughter, Rebecca Reynolds
18 Johnson, a son, Shelby V. Johnson, Sr., and a grandson, Will
19 Johnson; she is survived by a daughter and son-in-law, Patricia
20 Tish and Sam Ross of Hattiesburg; son and daughter-in-law, Paul B.
21 III "Chipper" and Betty Johnson of Hattiesburg; daughter-in-law,
22 Shirley Sarris of Jackson; her brother, James M. Power of Memphis,
23 TN; grandchildren Kimmen Johnson and Shelby Johnson, Jr., of
24 Jackson, MS, and Jennifer Stewart, Burney Johnson, Andrew Johnson
25 and Patrick Johnson of Hattiesburg; the delight of her life in her
26 later years was her three great-grandchildren, Shelby and Zachary
27 Stewart of Hattiesburg and Anne Marie Johnson of Jackson; and

28 WHEREAS, it is with great sadness that we recognize the
29 passing of this wonderful southern lady who was such an asset to
30 our state:

31 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
32 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
33 we do hereby commend the life of former First Lady of Mississippi
34 Dorothy P. Johnson, and express the sympathy of the Legislature on
35 her passing.
