9	seven, when his father taught him how to handle a knife; and
10	WHEREAS, he is known for his distinctive carvings of animals
11	which he creates using a pocketknife, and he exhibits his work and
12	demonstrates woodcarving throughout the South and Southwest; and
13	WHEREAS, Mr. Berry has been an influential traditional artist
14	in Mississippi since moving here from his native Oklahoma in 1972
15	to teach at the Piney Woods School; and
16	WHEREAS, a 1999 recipient of the Mississippi Arts Commission
17	Folk Art Fellowship, his works are in museums and private
18	collections from Maine to Oklahoma; he has been featured on
19	Mississippi ETV, area television and radio programs and in
20	numerous national publications; in 1996 and 1997, Mr. Berry was
21	the commissioned artist for the Governor's Awards for Excellence
22	in the Arts; with a woodcarving career that spans more than 50
23	years, he is a charter member and Fellow of the Craftsmen's Guild
24	of Mississippi and a recipient of the Guild's highest award for
25	Lifetime Achievement and Professional Accomplishments; and
26	WHEREAS, a self-taught artist, Mr. Berry has a strong

commitment to artistic excellence and delights in sharing his art

29 woodcarving and is now passing this on to his grandchildren and 30 hundreds of other children as he travels the state each year presenting woodcarving demonstrations and workshops; Mr. Berry 31 32 also teaches weekly woodcarving classes for the Craftsmen's Guild; 33 Mr. Berry prefers to carve and whittle with a simple pocketknife, 34 using no other tools or equipment; he still carves many nights past midnight and as late as 3:00 a.m. on weekends; Mr. Berry is 35 rarely without his favorite pocketknife and a sturdy twig or two 36 37 that in a few seconds he can transform into a bouquet of 38 delicately shaved flowers for an impromptu audience, because most of all, George Berry is a woodcarver who loves to carve: 39 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 40 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 41 we do hereby commend and congratulate George Berry upon his 42 receipt of the 2001 Artist's Achievement Award of the Governor's 43 Awards for Excellence in the Arts, and wish him continued success 44 in his future artistic endeavors. 45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be 46 47 presented to George Berry and his family at the Awards Ceremony to be held on Friday, February 9, 2001, and be made available to the 48 49 Capitol Press Corps.
