4	WHEREAS, Ole Miss' Rod Barnes was named the 2001 Naismith							
5	National Men's Coach of the Year, announced by the Atlanta Tipoff							
6	Club; the award is Barnes' second National Coach of the Year							
7	honor, as he was named CollegeInsider.com's recipient on March 11,							
8	2001; and							
9	WHEREAS, across the country, there are many outstanding							
10	coaches who are doing incredible jobs with their teams and							
11	programs, and for Coach Barnes to receive this award reflects on							
12	everybody associated with the Ole Miss basketball program - the							
13	players, assistant coaches and staff; and							
14	WHEREAS, all Naismith award recipients will be honored at a							
15	banquet in Atlanta in early April 2001; and							
16	WHEREAS, Barnes was one of 20 finalists for the Naismith							
17	National Coach of the Year Award, and one of three Southeastern							
18	Conference coaches up for the honor; and							
19	WHEREAS, Barnes was also named the SEC Coach of the Year by							
20	the league's coaches, Associated Press and CollegeInsider.com; and							
21	WHEREAS, this season, Barnes has guided the Rebels to a 27-8							
22	overall record, an 11-5 SEC mark and the SEC Western Division							
23	crown. The SEC West title was Ole Miss' third in the last five							
24	years. Ole Miss, which was ranked No. 14 in the Associated Press							
25	(AP) Top 25 poll and No. 13 in ESPN/USA Today Top 25 poll,							

advanced to the SEC Championship Game against Kentucky, advanced

to its first-ever NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance and met

- 28 No. 4 Arizona (25-7) in the Midwest Regional semifinals on Friday,
- 29 March 23, 2001, losing 65-55 in a very hard-fought game, televised
- 30 by CBS; the Rebels were the No. 3 seed, while Arizona was the No.
- 31 2 seed; and
- 32 WHEREAS, on February 17, 2001, Barnes won his 60th game as
- 33 the Rebel mentor and reached the 60-win milestone, the fastest of
- 34 any head coach in Ole Miss history. Barnes' 60th victory was a
- 35 67-61 win over South Carolina. Barnes' coaching record now stands
- 36 at 66-35; and
- WHEREAS, Barnes played four seasons for the Rebel program
- 38 from 1984-1988. During his playing career, Barnes earned All-SEC
- 39 honors and All-America honorable mention accolades from The
- 40 Sporting News in 1988. He finished third in the coaches'
- 41 balloting for SEC Player of the Year in 1988; and
- WHEREAS, the Naismith Awards, in their 33rd year, are given
- 43 in honor of the inventor of the game of basketball, Dr. James
- 44 Naismith. The awards program was founded by the Atlanta Tipoff
- 45 Club, an organization dedicated to recognizing the achievements of
- 46 student-athletes in basketball. The awards, including Men's and
- 47 Women's College Player of the Year, Men's and Women's Coach of the
- 48 Year, Male and Female Prep Player of the Year, and Men's and
- 49 Women's Official of the Year, are determined by a vote of the
- 50 Naismith Board of Selectors. In addition, the Board of Selectors,
- 51 comprised of a select group of leading basketball coaches,
- 52 journalists and administrators, honors a Men's and Women's
- 53 Outstanding Contributor to Basketball; and
- 54 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the

- 56 in the game of college basketball, who makes the game so exciting
